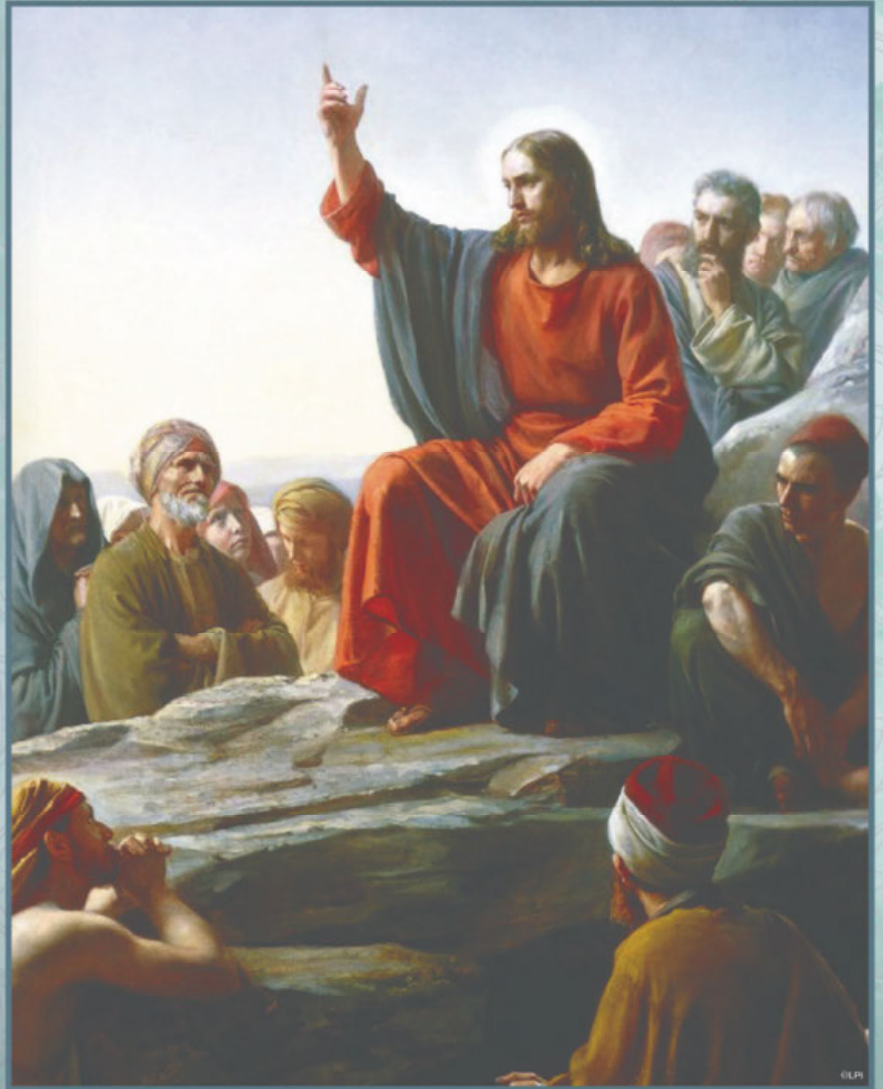

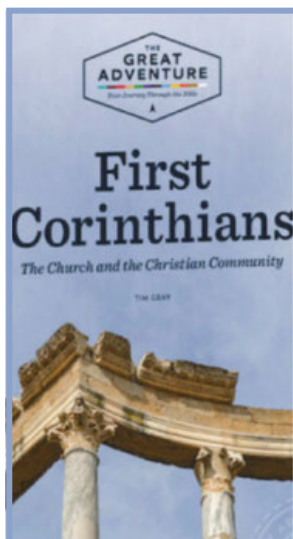

A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥147 (Matt 瑪13:44-46)

“天國”是什麼樣子？“國”（*basileia*）其實是政治術語，但耶穌在這裡用它來描述信眾團體，即在地上承行主旨完美如同在天上的團體。換言之，天主在天國裡與人合一，同時，人在天地共融中與天主相遇。耶穌通過描繪“天國”，指向那些履行天主旨意分享天主的神聖生命；最終，他們將與天主一起享受永恆平安喜樂。耶穌將“天國”比喻為藏在地裡寶貝和寶貴珍珠，闡明天國在生命中的首要地位。這兩個比喻表明，當人認識天國無比價值時，一切都可放下，包括生命。換言之，在地上放下越多，就越接近天國。

耶穌用這兩個比喻告訴我們，天國值得我們放下一切去獲得。他來，是為給我們天國這顆無價珍珠。同時，這兩個比喻也挑戰我們信德和門徒身分。它們強調基督徒必須全心投入和奉獻生命。當發現耶穌時，其他一切都變得次要。

大多時候，人們，甚至其中一些是基督徒，都在追逐虛假寶藏。他們對過去感到後悔，或過度擔心未來。結果，豐盛的現在就過去了，寶藏也永遠找不到。結果，在地上找不到寶貝，在天國也得不到，永遠。

### Truth: One Day We will Die.

When we love Jesus, the logical extension is to want to be with Him more and more and, happily, that is exactly what He wants too! In fact, He wants to be with us for all eternity, and His life, death, and Resurrection has made that possible. This month's topics reflect the readings you will hear at Sunday Masses as we wind down the end of the liturgical year; "No one knows the hour or the day," "My kingdom does not belong to this world," and "Be vigilant at all times." 1 Corinthians 2:9 tells us that we cannot even imagine how amazing eternity will be, so it is well worth our time to make sure we are ready!

**Focus of the Gospel:**

Our readings next week are powerful in that they direct our attention not to our status or wealth, but rather to an attitude of trust in God above all things. In 1 Kings 17 (part of the Old Testament - before Jesus), Elijah the prophet encounters a poor widow who has in mind to use her remaining flour and oil to make one more meal for herself and her son. She trusted the words of Elijah who promised she would have enough not only for the day, but for a whole year. In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus points out similar faith in another widow who puts in the temple treasury all she has. She had very little, yet she gave it ALL to God and trusted in His Divine Providence. Imagine being the widow and Elijah telling you to use it to prepare something for him, and then use what is left to prepare something for yourself and your family. Would you be able to do it? What if Jesus came to you and said, "...go, sell all you have and give to the poor; then, come, follow me."?

**Enfoque del evangelio:**

Nuestras lecturas de la próxima semana son poderosas porque dirigen nuestra atención no a nuestro estatus o riqueza, sino a una actitud de confianza en Dios por encima de todas las cosas. En 1 Reyes 17 (parte del Antiguo Testamento - antes de Jesús), el profeta Elías se encuentra con una viuda pobre que tiene en mente utilizar la harina y el aceite que le quedan para hacer una comida más para ella y su hijo. Ella confió en las palabras de Elías, que le prometió que tendría suficiente no sólo para ese día, sino para todo un año. En el Evangelio de Marcos, Jesús señala una fe similar en otra viuda que deposita en el tesoro del templo todo lo que tiene. Tenía muy poco, pero lo dio TODO a Dios y confió en su divina Providencia. Imagínate que fueras la viuda y Elías te dijera que lo usaras para prepararle algo, y luego usaras lo que quedara para prepararte algo para ti y tu familia. ¿Serías capaz de hacerlo?

Brothers and sisters:

The levitical priests were many because they were prevented by death from remaining in office, but Jesus, because he remains forever, has a priesthood that does not pass away. Therefore, he is always able to save those who approach God through him, since he lives forever to make intercession for them.

It was fitting that we should have such a high priest: holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, higher than the heavens. He has no need, as did the high priests, to offer sacrifice day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did that once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints men subject to weakness to be high priests, but the word of the oath, which was taken after the law, appoints a son, who has been made perfect forever.

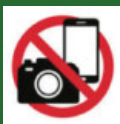

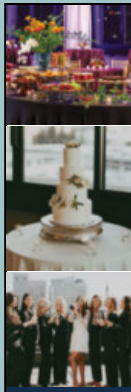

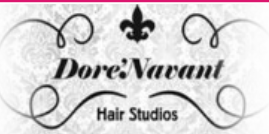
