

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION



Today's readings focus on the personal, passionate, and merciful love of God which should fill us with unending gratitude to Him. This gratitude is the fuel, if

you will, that keeps the stewardship way of life rolling along.

In our Second Reading, from St. Paul's letter to Timothy, we find a grateful Paul who says of himself, "I was once a blasphemer and a persecutor and arrogant, but I have been mercifully treated." St. Paul is well aware of the sins he has committed. But this does not hold him back from ministry. Rather, it makes him all the more grateful to be God's steward. How encouraging to know that this is true for us as well. Our past sins, and even our present struggles, do not disqualify us from becoming God's grateful stewards.

Jesus gives us several poignant illustrations of His merciful love in today's Gospel reading from Luke. Let us focus on one, in particular — the story of the lost sheep. He asks, "What man among you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them would not leave the ninety -nine... and go after the lost one until he finds it?"

The logical response is no one! It simply does not make sense to spend time and energy searching for one lost sheep when there are so many others to tend to. But God's logic, God's mercy, defies human logic. And who is the lost one? It is every one of us when we stray away from God through sin, great or small.

What gratitude we owe to such a personal, passionate, loving God! Just think, even our sins, once forgiven, become a source of fuel for our stewardship way of life as we reflect with deep gratitude on the powerful mercy of our Savior.

STEWARDSHIP RENEWAL

In the past two Sunday bulletins (August 28 and September 4), on page three, information was provided to help us understand what Stewardship is and set the stage for the Cathedral Stewardship Renewal journey that occurs over three Sundays in September. (If you missed reading these bulletins, you will find them in the Bulletin Archive on the Cathedral website at www/cathedral sacramento.org).

FIRST SUNDAY -- INTRODUCTION TO RENEWAL

This week we kick off our parish Stewardship Renewal. Today is the first Sunday of our annual parish-wide Stewardship Renewal. This is the time of year when we make our written commitments to prayer, parish ministries, and offertory giving – our time, talent, and treasure. We do this after taking time to re-evaluate our faith lives, our relationship with God, and our service to each other in our daily lives. As a parish family, we underscore the importance of this time of Renewal – not just for our parish, but for each of you individually.

Soon you will receive a package of Stewardship materials in the U.S. mail. Please prayerfully review these materials and discern where God is calling you in the coming year. In this package, there will be a booklet providing Stewardship messages and a listing of all the Cathedral ministries. Please examine this list to determine which ministry you are interested in serving.

Also in the package is a Commitment Card that you will complete and turn in on Commitment Sunday, September 25.

SECOND SUNDAY – LAYWITNESS TALKS and MINISTRY FAIR

On the Second Renewal Sunday, the 18th, we will hear from a parishioner who will briefly share how he/she has grown in faith by embracing stewardship as a way of life and grown closer to God as a result. Following Mass, we are invited to attend the Ministry Fair in Mercy Hall to learn more about our parish ministries by talking with parishioners who are involved. This is an opportunity to better understand how each ministry serves the Cathedral and our parish family. By viewing the ministry displays and talking with ministry members, we can determine which ministry we want to offer our talent. Also, this is an opportunity to share fellowship with our parish brothers and sisters and enjoy refreshments.

THIRD SUNDAY - COMMITMENT SUNDAY

On September 25, our Renewal journey culminates with Commitment Sunday. On this day, we will bring our Commitment Card to Mass. During Mass, as a parish community, we will offer God our individual gifts of time, talent, and treasure for the coming year.

Throughout this Renewal journey consider all that God has blessed us with, and how we can use these blessings to serve Him. Our goal as a Cathedral parish is to be a Stewardship Parish – a community who is noticeably committed to prayer, parish ministry, and generous financial support. May God bless you as you discern how He is calling us to grow closer to Him this year.

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Since God created human beings, we have struggled to keep our focus on God. We wrestle with the question of "who is God" and foolishly believe some of God's job description can be better completed by us. We wander in different directions, lose our way, think that happiness can be found elsewhere and even construct golden calves to worship. Are we simply too independent or just blatantly stubborn? It's a good question to ask. Even with all of our silliness and distractions, God compassionately and patiently waits. He lets us assert our wills and knows that perhaps one day we will actually wake up and realize how lost we are.

"Since happiness is nothing other than the enjoyment of the highest good and since the highest good is above, no one can be made happy unless he rises above himself, not by an ascent of the body but of the heart. But we cannot rise above ourselves unless a higher power lifts us up ... Divine aid is available to those who seek it from their hearts, humbly and devoutly; and this means to sigh for it in this valley of tears, through fervent prayer (St. Bonaveture)." One of the biggest human struggles is discerning what, exactly, is the highest good. We are ordered to achieve it but if we pursue it with clouded vision, we will never truly find it.

One of the greatest obstacles to God's power and love is a stubborn, closed heart of stone. When we are fiercely determined to set our sights elsewhere for happiness or simply ride the popular currents of the day, we will never satisfy the deep ache and longing within. We know that ache well. It is precisely why we scurry all over the place, attempting to find the next best thing to take away its pain. Nothing in the created world ever can or will. We continue our journey. One day, people may wake up and realize that they are grazing in the wrong pasture and putting themselves in harm's way. When this awakening occurs, it will be a most joyous day as we will see God's wide-open arms waiting to receive us. "Lead me, Lord, in your path, and I will enter in your truth. Let my heart rejoice that it may fear your name (St. Bonaventure)."

ALENTAR UN ENTENDIMIENTO MÁS PROFUNDO DE LA ESCRITURA

En cada uno de los domingos pasados, la Palabra de Dios nos invitaba a ser mejores seguidores de Jesús. La liturgia de hoy no se queda atrás, hay que seguir con mucho entusiasmo y fidelidad su enseñanza. Atrévete, nos dirá el Señor, levántate y ponte en camino hacia el Padre. El Papa Francisco en sus excelentes catequesis nos exhorta a lo siguiente: "Dios espera siempre que reanudemos el viaje, nos espera con paciencia, nos ve cuando todavía estamos lejos, sale a nuestro encuentro, nos abraza, nos besa, nos perdona. ¡Así es Dios! ¡Así es nuestro Padre! Y su perdón borra el pasado y nos regenera en el amor".

¿Has experimentado el perdón de Dios? Me imagino que sí. Porque si has perdonado a alguien que te ha ofendido, de seguro que has gozado del perdón de Dios en tu vida. El Evangelio, en este domingo, es rico en alegría y perdón. Las cien ovejas y la búsqueda de una sola que estaba perdida: "Alégrense conmigo, porque he encontrado la oveja que se me había perdido" (Lucas 15,6). La mujer que pierde una moneda de las diez que tiene, y su alegría de encontrarla: "Alégrense conmigo, porque hallé la moneda que se me había perdido" (Lucas 15,9). Estas dos parábolas indican la iniciativa de Dios, quien busca, encuentra y se alegra. En la tercera parábola, la del hijo pródigo, la iniciativa de Dios se basa en la libertad y el respeto por el ser humano.

God Wants Everyone to Come Back to Him



In today's Gospel we hear three parables. In the first Jesus tells about the shepherd who lost one of his hundred sheep. But even though he had so many, he still cared about the one that was lost and went out to find it. God is like that too: even though He has so many people to look after He still cares about you in particular.

The next parable is similar, with the woman searching all over her house when she loses one of her special coins. She rejoices when she finds it, just like the angels rejoice in Heaven when a sinner turns back to God.

The last parable that Jesus tells is the story of the prodigal son. We are like the son in that story when we run away from God by sinning. But like the father, God is waiting and watching for us to be sorry and come back to

Him. All we have to do is tell Him we are sorry for our sins in Confession and He will be so happy to have us back!

En el Evangelio de hoy escuchamos tres parábolas. En el primero Jesús habla del pastor que perdió una de sus cien ovejas. A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥39

Christians have a vision as reconcilers and peacemakers. However, somehow they become anxious people because of the impact of life problems. That is the loss of faith when they opt for anxiety rather than believing in God. Some even choose to deny this kind of loss but gratefully, some mourn. This is how the spiritual journey starts. When people mourn their loss of faith, they are affirmed by Jesus that they will be comforted.

Jesus said, "If your right eye causes you to sin, pluck it out and throw it away;" and also "if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away." The purpose of doing these is emphasized by Jesus: "it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body goes into hell."

Jesus exaggerated the detachment of committing sin by using two extreme verbs "pluck" and "cut" in order to insist the real loss of life if people choose to sin against God. The verb "lose" (apolētai) means killing or destroying. Either "pluck" or "cut" denotes those things which on being thrown away are finally decomposed. Here Jesus pointed out the result of leaving God is certainly eternal death.

The chief accusation which Christ brought against these people is their observing of externals, which gave them a great show of piety before the people, an impression which they were very careful to nourish. By protecting their worldly vanity, they give up heaven instead. These people are far from true piety and righteousness of the heart. Someone might ask: "Why are people stupid, silly, and stubborn to this extent?" The devil will provide the best answer.

Christians make choices every day. The choice of either heaven or hell depends on what they opt for their lives, in short, heaven or hell is their own choice.

基督徒,可能都有成為和平或修和使者的願景。

然而,由於生活的種種衝擊,變成終日憂心忡忡的人。當選擇焦慮而不是信仰時,這就是信德的喪失。 有些人甚至愚昧到這個地步,就是自以為是否認信德的喪失。選擇悔改的,神修因此開始。當人從罪惡 悔改時,耶穌肯定給他們安慰,是永生。

耶穌說: "若是你的右眼使你跌倒,剜出它來,從你身上扔掉。"還有: "若你的右手使你跌倒,砍下它來,從你身上扔掉。"這樣做,目的如耶穌強調: "因為喪失你一個肢體,比你全身投入地獄裡,為你更好。"

耶穌利用誇張手法,來強調犯罪對人的毀滅是不能改寫的;兩個極端動詞"剜出來"(exele)以及"砍下來"(ekkopson),都在說明選擇犯罪離開天主,就會真正失去生命,即永生。

動詞"喪失"(apolētai)解作殺戮或毀滅。無論是"剜"或"砍"都表示那些被扔掉的東西總有一天腐朽。 離開天主,結果就是肯定的永死。

基督對虛假宗教領導的主要指控,是他們只管假裝自己非常神聖;為了保護世俗虛榮,寧可喪失天堂。有人可能會問:"人為什麼愚蠢、無聊及頑固到這種地步?"魔鬼會提供最佳答案。

基督徒每天選擇天堂或地獄,都是取決於他們選擇哪種生活。

一念天堂,一念地獄。
