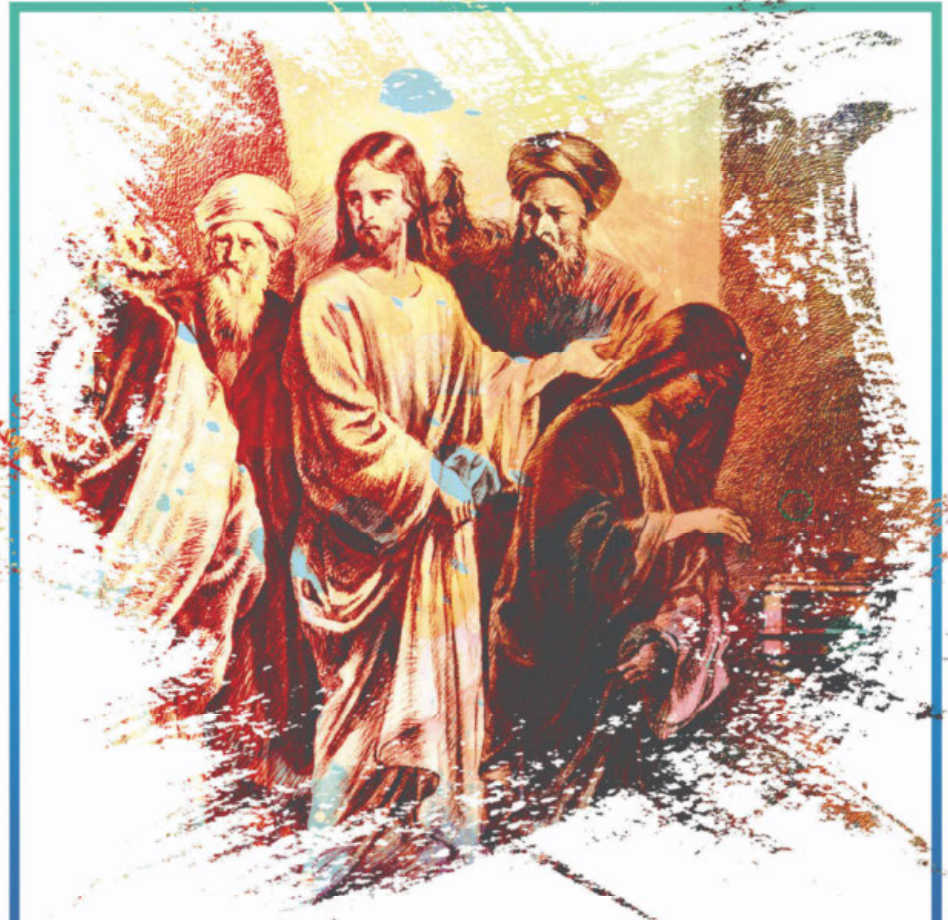



A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥 148 (Matt 瑪 13:36-43)

Fr. Abraham Chiu 趙必成神父

天主為何允許魔鬼與惡人一同攻擊教會？除了煉淨教會，如篩選好麥與壞麥之外，最重要原因之一，就是尊重人的自由。耶穌從不強迫或控制任何人相信天主，他只簡單地說：“有耳的，聽吧！”信仰不靠強迫，是愛。

耶穌向門徒逐點闡述撒種比喻；莠子是邪惡的子民，仇人是魔鬼。然而，末世有收穫時期。耶穌說：“收穫時期，即是今世的終結；收割者即是天使。”“收穫”（*therismos*）一詞表示最後審判時刻，那時義人被聚集到天國，惡人則因自我審判而下地獄去。

耶穌早已警告邪惡世界，所有人將根據他們塵世生命接受最後審判。末日，當最後審判降臨每人頭上，耶穌描述：“人子要差遣他的天使，由他的國內，將一切使人跌倒的事，及作惡的人收集起來，扔到火窯裡。”“使人跌倒的事”（*skandala*）隱喻任何使人陷入罪惡的人或事。然而，耶穌掌握整個世界權柄，他的復活將復活所有遠離罪惡世界的人，即使他們被迫害致死。因此，作為審判之主，耶穌將陪伴教會走過整個低谷、苦難和復活的過程。

比喻的闡述讓我們前瞻最後審判，尤其被魔鬼困住時刻。耶穌的死亡和復活總是與我們同在，他的逾越節奧跡帶給我們希望。

### Lord, You Are Our Hope

As we near the end of the Liturgical Year—Cycle B in the Sunday readings, the Church reflects more on the “end things” and our future beyond this life. Our Community Day helped us look at the time of Jesus’ return. No one knows when Jesus will come back to earth, but we trust in His promise. We proclaim it all the time with the Mystery of Faith: **“We proclaim Your death, O Lord, and profess Your Resurrection until You come again.”**

*We are encouraged, then to learn the Act of Hope this month, and memorize Psalm 71:5 (see kids corner QR for the song). Lord, you are our Hope!*

**Focus of the Gospel:**

The focus of our readings next week is much like that of the first Sunday of Advent—the coming of Christ at the end of time. Our church year begins and ends with the conviction that Christ will come again and that he will bring judgment. We are told here to look for signs, while in Advent we called to “stay awake, be ready.” Our reading from Mark tells us that some of these signs are what will signal the end. These signs, however, are apocalyptic—dealing with the future, the last days in highly symbolic language—all pointing to the reality that Christ will come again. For Christians, the Second Coming is awaited with joy. The apocalyptic language in the readings appears to suggest fear, but not for those “who are wise and have helped bring about justice” - not for those who believe.

**With Your Family**

- ◆ Read Mark 13:22-32
- ◆ It says that “people will come and do great things...they will try to make you stop believing in God...” Is this already happening in our society? Are there places where speaking God’s name is not accepted?
- ◆ Jesus says the world will pass away but His Word will never pass away. What does this tell us about where our priorities should be?
- ◆ Pray Psalm 16:5-11 together.

**Enfoque del evangelio:**

El tema central de nuestras lecturas de la próxima semana es muy parecido al del primer domingo de Adviento: la venida de Cristo al final de los tiempos. Nuestro año eclesialístico comienza y termina con la convicción de que Cristo vendrá de nuevo y que traerá el juicio. Aquí se nos dice que busquemos señales, mientras que en Adviento se nos llama a «estar despiertos, preparados». Nuestra lectura de Marcos nos dice que algunos de estos signos son los que señalarán el fin. Estos signos, sin embargo, son apocalípticos -tratan del futuro, de los últimos días en un lenguaje altamente simbólico- y todos apuntan a la realidad de que Cristo vendrá de nuevo. Para los cristianos, la Segunda Venida se espera con alegría. El lenguaje apocalíptico de las lecturas parece sugerir miedo, pero no para aquellos «que son sabios y han ayudado a hacer justicia», no para los que creen.

# Liturgy of the Word

THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

NOVEMBER 10, 2024

**Reading I**     **1 Kgs 17:10-16**

In those days, Elijah the prophet went to Zarephath. As he arrived at the entrance of the city, a widow was gathering sticks there; he called out to her, "Please bring me a small cupful of water to drink." She left to get it, and he called out after her, "Please bring along a bit of bread."

She answered, "As the LORD, your God, lives, I have nothing baked; there is only a handful of flour in my jar and a little oil in my jug. Just now I was collecting a couple of sticks, to go in and prepare something for myself and my son; when we have eaten it, we shall die." Elijah said to her, "Do not be afraid. Go and do as you propose. But first make me a little cake and bring it to me. Then you can prepare something for yourself and your son. For the LORD, the God of Israel, says, "The jar of flour shall not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, until the day when the LORD sends rain upon the earth."

She left and did as Elijah had said. She was able to eat for a year, and he and her son as well; the jar of flour did not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, as the LORD had foretold through Elijah.

**Reading II**     **Heb 9:24-28**

Christ did not enter into a sanctuary made by hands, a copy of the true one, but heaven itself, that he might now appear before God on our behalf. Not that he might offer himself repeatedly, as the high priest enters each year into the sanctuary with blood that is not his own; if that were so, he would have had to suffer repeatedly from the foundation of the world. But now once for all he has appeared at the end of the ages to take away sin by his sacrifice. Just as it is appointed that human beings die once, and after this the judgment, so also Christ, offered once to take away the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to take away sin but to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him.

**Gospel**     **Mk 12:38-44**

In the course of his teaching Jesus said to the crowds, "Beware of the scribes, who like to go around in long robes and accept greetings in the marketplaces, seats of honor in synagogues, and places of honor at banquets. They devour the houses of widows and, as a pretext recite lengthy prayers. They will receive a very severe condemnation."

He sat down opposite the treasury and observed how the crowd put money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow also came and put in two small coins worth a few cents.

Calling his disciples to himself, he said to them, "Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood."

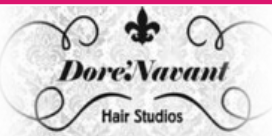
