STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION



In St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians, it states "If they were all one part, where would the body be? But as it is there are many parts, yet one body" (1 COR 12:18-20).

What does this teach us as Christian stewards? It shows us that we all have equal dignity and worth in God's sight and that if God sees us as equally precious, we should view each other in this same light. It teaches us to humbly recognize our gifts as well as the giftedness of every member of our parish family. And, while God designed us to be ultimately dependent on Him, it seems He has also designed us to need each other!

This is part of the beauty and richness of a stewardship way of life. No one person can "do it all" in life — whether in family life or parish life. But God does not ask us to do it all. He simply asks us to share the gifts and talents we do have in the season of life we find ourselves in right now. It might feel uncomfortable at first. But the good news is you don't have to do it all. Do your part, let your brothers and sisters in the Body of Christ do theirs, and know that the Spirit of the Lord is upon us all as we live out this stewardship way of life.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aguinas (1225 -1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "The Summa Theologiae." Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The Summa Theologiae, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today.




s Christians, its not always easy to understand how Christ wants us to serve Him. For many of us, we sincerely want to live our lives for Jesus and to reveal how central He is in our lives and all people's lives. Of course, there are many times when we avoid thinking about Jesus, just as there are many people, even Christians, who never actually spend time wondering what Jesus wants from us.

In the early church, much thought and prayer were directed toward Christ's relationship with those who believed in Him. St. Paul writes in his letters how clearly the Church needed to make Christ its foundation and center. His letters also reveal how the different church communities would often stray from the message of Jesus and be overly focused on human desires and misconceptions. St. Paul's letters are as meaningful today as ever.

We hear from St. Paul today that the Church, although many members, is one body. For this body, the Church, to function and grow properly, its body parts must work together. The individual people that make up the Church must work together, seeing that each member has a specific gift or talent that adds to the whole. This thinking is contrary in a society in which we are competing against each other, creating divisions, categories, winners and losers, and disharmony. The inability of humans to work together stifles the growth of the Church. It's difficult to step out of competition and view our time, talents, and treasure as something meant for the greater good. It takes sacrifice and humility to offer back all we've been given to the One who gave it, but that is ultimately what will allow the Body to be fully united with its Head, Jesus our Life.


Omo cristianos, no siempre es fácil entender cómo Cristo quiere que le sirvamos. Para muchos de nosotros, sinceramente queremos vivir nuestras vidas para Jesús y revelar cuán central es Él en nuestras vidas y en las vidas de todas las personas. Por supuesto, hay muchas veces en que evitamos pensar en Jesús, al igual que hay muchas personas, incluso cristianos, que en realidad nunca pasan tiempo preguntándose qué quiere Jesús de nosotros.

En la iglesia primitiva, mucho pensamiento y oración se dirigía hacia la relación de Cristo con aquellos que creían en Él. San Pablo escribe en sus cartas cuán claramente la Iglesia necesitaba hacer de Cristo su fundamento y centro. Sus cartas también revelan cómo las diferentes comunidades de la iglesia a menudo se apartaban del mensaje de Jesús y se centraban demasiado en los deseos humanos y los conceptos erróneos. Las cartas de San Pablo son tan significativas hoy como siempre.

Hoy escuchamos de San Pablo que la Iglesia, aunque muchos miembros, es un solo cuerpo. Para que este cuerpo, la Iglesia, funcione y crezca adecuadamente, las partes de su cuerpo deben trabajar juntas al igual que las personas individuales que componen la Iglesia deben trabajar juntas, viendo que cada miembro tiene un don o talento específico que se suma al conjunto. Este pensamiento es al contrario en una sociedad en la que estamos compitiendo entre nosotros, creando divisiones, categorías, ganadores y perdedores, y desarmonía. La incapacidad de los seres humanos para trabajar juntos sofoca el crecimiento de la Iglesia. Es difícil salir de la competencia y ver nuestro tiempo, talentos y tesoros como algo destinado a para algo mucho mejor. Se necesita sacrificio y humildad para ofrecer de nuevo todo lo que se nos ha dado a Aquel que lo dio, pero eso es en última instancia lo que permitirá que el Cuerpo esté completamente unido con su Cabeza, Jesús nuestra Vida.


La Iglesia es un Cuerpo



A Glimpse of Spirituality (靈修一瞥) 7 Fr. Abraham Chiu (趙必成神父)

Do we close the doors of our hearts to Jesus who is looking for a place to be born in our lives?

There is no point in being sentimental about the doors slammed by the folks in Bethlehem, when there is no room in our own hearts for the same Jesus coming in the form of the poor and the needy. If we are hungry, it is a physical problem. If our neighbors are hungry but we still dispose much leftover or even expired food and drink every day, it is a spiritual problem (Nicolai Berdyaev). Neglecting the old, being contemptuous of the poor, and having no thought for the lonely, these attitudes of life ignore those individuals with whom Christ has so closely identified himself.

To reverence each human life, and treat others respectfully as Jesus the incarnate God, we have already offered our gold, myrrh, and frankincense to Jesus.

Let our hearts be transformed by Jesus into empathetic ones.

Plant Your Works in the Word

The spirit of the Lord is upon me. Luke 4:18

One of the things about Scripture is that even the smallest word and shortest phrase can be critical to the overall message. When you take a guiet moment to rest with the Word, you find how quickly the most mundane sentence can reach out and grab you, pulling you into a deeper contemplation of some truth you hadn't even considered until then.

But we often fail to act as the Israelites in the Book of Nehemiah, standing before the Water Gate "listening attentively." Whether it's at Mass during the Liturgy of the Word or at home poring over the Bible, time after time we find ourselves less mindful than we could be. Our ears accept the sounds of the words and our eyes glance over the shape of the letters. But are we mindful — truly?

The best answer is hopefully at least sometimes. There are always tasks to be completed, problems weighing on our minds that we can't quite give over to God. We lose ourselves in these things instead of in Scripture. We "clock in" with Bible reading instead of "diving in."

We can never forget that the words of the Lord are spirit and life. They are the soil that quickens the seed of all stewardship. There is no mindfulness, no prayer, no graciousness, no gratitude or accountability or sense of commitment unless there is the Word.

So let us pray today for mindfulness, that our every action will be grounded in the law of God — giving it true spirit and life.

有關於聖經裡的一件事是, 即使是最小的詞彙和最短的詞 組,也可能對整個訊息至關重要。當你沉靜於某些字句的片 刻時, 你會發現這些句子如何迅速的攫住你, 將你拉進更深 層次的思考,甚至思考那些在之前從未想過的真理。

但我們常常沒有像舊約厄斯德拉(下)的以色列人那樣, 站在 水門廣場前"側耳靜聽"。無論是在彌撒中的聖道禮儀, 或在 家中研讀聖經,我們發現自己一次又一次的漫不經心,

我們的耳朵接收著字句的聲音,我們的眼睛瞥**見字句的形** 狀。但是我們真的有在意嗎 - 真的嗎?

最好的答案是希望至少有時候是的,總是有需要完成這一些 任務,而壓在我們心中的困難是,我們無法將自己完全交託 於天主。我們迷失在事情中而不是在聖經中,我們在閱讀聖 經中"打卡",而不是"沉潜"。

我們永遠不能忘記,天主的聖言就是精神和生命。他們是使 天主僕人工作的種子加速的土壤,除非有聖言,否則就沒有 正念,沒有祈禱,沒有恩寵,沒有感恩,沒有責任感,或沒 有承諾感。

所以, 今天讓我們為正念祈禱, 讓我們每個行動都基於天主 的法律 - 賦予它真正的精神和生命。
