STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Often, we live our lives striving for temporary happiness. But today, Jesus reminds us to “not work for food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life.”

Our Eucharistic meal is the Spiritual Food that we consume — Jesus Himself, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. It will satisfy us as Jesus says, “I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst.”

We all have the need to be satisfied. It is in our humanity. And in that incompleteness, we grab at what surrounds us to satisfy our hearts. It could be the next job promotion, the comforts in our homes, the next trip we plan to take. The list goes on. We might think to ourselves, ‘then I will be happier.’ Or maybe we don’t even realize how we are relying on those things or events in our lives.

And while many of those things are good and bring us joy, they are only a small glimpse of the deeper, lasting happiness that the Lord offers us. They are gifts that should remind us of our Good and Gracious Creator. Instead of placing undue importance on those things or people, place it on Jesus, as He says, “Whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst.” He is the One who fills our hearts.

As you go about your day-to-day lives this week, try to recognize the times you are “working for food that perishes” by seeking things of the world to satisfy your heart. In those moments, recall that everything we have is a gift from God. Instead of misusing that gift, offer a prayer of thanksgiving for all He has given to you.

PASTOR'S CORNER



As many of you are aware, we at the Cathedral are working towards a greater understanding of how we are stewards of God's creation. We accept that God has revealed Himself through His creation and that we, part of His creation, have been raised to the high position of caring for that creation. Our lives are centered on how we use the gifts God has given to us to help His glory be revealed throughout the world. All our endeavors and achievements are meant for one purpose, to care for God's creation and reveal His glory. This is the truth of our lives, whether we believe in God or not.

Stewardship is not the process of taking the things that are God's and using them for ourselves. It is not accepting the gifts from God so that we can create our own little kingdoms. It is not an approach to Christ in the hope of gaining more in the created world. These paths are contrary to our call as a Christian and as humans, and they lead to darkness and loss.

As Jesus offers Himself as the Bread of Life, we gain greater insight into our own call as stewards. The listeners of His time were confused in believing that eating the Bread of Life would help them in living their own lives. The truth is, eating the Bread of Life does not help us live our own lives. Rather, eating the Bread of Life joins us into living the life of Christ. As we eat the Body of Christ, the Bread of Life, we must speak the words of St. Paul that the life we live is not our own, no longer us but Christ who lives within us. The Bread of Life is not nutrition but transformation. It is dying to one's self and rising to a life in Christ. And as stewards, it is Christ Himself who is truly present in His creation caring for the world and glorifying His heavenly Father. There is no greater life to live than that of God's steward. For humans, there is no other life to live. We have been chosen for this, and we must live it out or die.

The Call to Stewardship EL LLAMADO A SER CORRESPONSABLE

Becoming a disciple of Jesus Christ leads naturally to the practice of stewardship. These linked realities, discipleship and stewardship, then make up the fabric of a Christian life in which each day is lived in an intimate, personal relationship with the Lord. This Christ-centered way of living has its beginning in Baptism, the sacrament of faith. As Vatican II remarks, all Christians are “bound to show forth, by the example of their lives and by the witness of their speech,” that new life of faith which begins in Baptism and is strengthened by the power of the Holy Spirit in Confirmation (Ad Gentes, no. 11). Faith joins individuals and the community of Jesus’ followers in intimacy with their Lord and leads them to live as his disciples. Union with Christ gives rise to a sense of solidarity and common cause between the disciples and the Lord and also among the disciples themselves. Refracted through the prisms of countless individual vocations, this way of life embodies and expresses the one mission of Christ: to do God’s will, to proclaim the Good News of salvation, to heal the afflicted, to care for one’s sisters and brothers, to give life—life to the full—as Jesus did.

Ser discípulos de Jesucristo nos lleva naturalmente a practicar la corresponsabilidad. Estas realidades entrelazadas, ser discípulo y corresponsable, constituyen el corazón de la vida cristiana en la que cada día se vive una relación íntima y personal con el Señor. Este modo de vida centrado en Cristo empieza en el bautismo, el sacramento de la fe. El Vaticano II dice que todos los cristianos “están obligados a manifestar con el ejemplo de su vida y el testimonio de la palabra” la nueva vida que recibieron en el bautismo y que fue fortalecida por el poder del Espíritu Santo en la confirmación (Ad Gentes, 11). La fe une íntimamente a las personas y a la comunidad de los seguidores de Jesús con el Señor y los conduce a vivir como sus discípulos. La unión con Cristo es la causa de un sentido de solidaridad y una causa común entre los discípulos y el Señor y también entre los discípulos mismos. Refractado en los prismas de innumerables vocaciones individuales, este modo de vida encarna y expresa la misión única de Cristo: hacer la voluntad de Dios, proclamar la Buena Nueva de salvación, sanar a los afligidos, cuidar a nuestras hermanas y hermanos, dar la vida —la vida entera— al igual que Jesús.

Summer of Faith: The Creed—Week 4 is.gd/summerlesson
Verano de Fe: el credo - Semana 4

Jesus changed everything for humanity. At the time of the fulfillment of God's promises, the Son of God entered into human history by assuming a human nature in the Person of Jesus Christ. God made His love for us known in the life, Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of His only Son. While His Sacrifice on the Cross paid the debt of sin and defeated death, it is not the only part of Christ's life that is important. On the contrary, everything Jesus did gives us a model for how to live. The Apostles' Creed does not give us details of Jesus' life before His Passion and Crucifixion, but the Gospels do. The Gospels are the books of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John—the four books of the Bible that tell the story of Jesus' life. In the Gospel of John, Jesus tells us, "I am the way and the truth and the life" (14:6). Through His life, Jesus reveals to us the truth of who He is, the life He has planned for us, and the way we are to live in order to spend eternity with Him in Heaven. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church says: "All that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day he was taken up to Heaven is to be seen in the light of the mysteries of Christmas and Easter" (CCC 512). Who is Jesus for you?

Jesús cambió todo por la humanidad En el tiempo en que debían cumplirse las promesas de Dios, el Hijo de Dios entró a la historia de la humanidad asumiendo una naturaleza humana en la Persona de Jesucristo. Dios nos dio a conocer el amor que nos tiene mediante la vida, Pasión, Muerte, Resurrección y Ascensión de su único Hijo. Si bien su sacrificio en la cruz pagó la deuda del pecado y derrotó a la muerte, esta no es la única parte de la vida de Cristo que tiene importancia. Por el contrario, todo lo que Jesús hizo es un modelo de cómo debemos de vivir. El Credo de los Apóstoles no nos da detalles sobre la vida de Jesús antes de su Pasión y Crucifixión, pero lo Evangelios sí lo hacen. Los Evangelios son los libros escritos por Mateo, Marcos, Lucas y Juan, son los cuatro libros de la Biblia que nos narran la historia de la vida de Jesús. En el Evangelio de Juan, Jesús nos dice, "Yo soy en camino y la verdad y la vida" (14, 6). Mediante su vida, Jesús nos revela la verdad de su ser, la vida que tiene planeada para nosotros y el camino que debemos de seguir para poder pasar la eternidad con Él en el cielo. Como dice el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica: "Todo lo que Jesús hizo y enseñó desde el principio hasta el día en que [...] fue llevado al cielo hay que verlo a la luz de los misterios de Navidad y de Pascua" (CIC 512). Entonces, ¿quién es Jesús?

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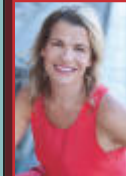
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
