### EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

It's All in the Basket

St. Therese of Lisieux made a point of going the extra mile in kindness towards those people who really got under her skin. It was part of her own brand of Everyday Stewardship — thanking God for all His creation, even the parts with which, in her own humanness, she struggled to cope.

I think about this a lot when I challenge myself to give thanks for things that bother me and people who challenge me. When I do this, I envision Christ giving thanks over those insufficient loaves. How many of us would see that paltry little basket and kick a rock in frustration because we can't feed all our people? "You didn't give me enough, Lord! You didn't give me enough patience, enough money, enough creativity, enough stamina to be a good steward. If you had given me more, I could also give more!"

In those moments of despair, we need to take a good look at the life God has given us. We need to look at the trials and the challenges and the shortcomings. The hopes that didn't pan out, the disappointments that keep cropping up. Somewhere therein lies what we need to be the steward God asks us to be, just as St. Therese's own stewardship was defined by the people she simply couldn't stand.

God does not give us all we want. He does not give us all we ask for. He does us one better: He gives us all we need. It's all in the basket.





STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION



*A steward makes God's love visible by imitating Jesus*

The servant and the little boy in our readings today are excellent examples for us as Christian stewards. The servant gave the very best of what he had, and the boy gave all that he had, then God did the rest. A key component of living as a good steward is constantly evaluating our lives, particularly our relationship with God to ensure we are not just scraping by but rather giving God our entire lives.

*We should ask ourselves — "how am I giving God my time, using my talents, and sharing my treasures?"*

We need to find what works best for us so that God can become a more significant part of our daily lives. We are also called to put our gifts and talents to good use too. The servant and the boy teach us that it is not up to us to decide how our gifts will affect others. God will do that. All we need to do is to give it well.

Lastly, the servant reminds us that we are called to give the first fruits of our treasures. It is easy to give something; it is difficult to give the finest gift. Giving our best requires us to reevaluate our priorities in life.

When we strive to live out our call as Christian stewards by entrusting all that we have been given to the One who graciously gave us these gifts, we will be blessed beyond measure. As we begin a new week, let us spend some time evaluating our relationship with God by asking, 'what is my very best, and am I giving it to God?'

## PASTOR'S CORNER

Summertime, with opportunities to be out in the wilderness or take time on trips vacationing, offers us the gift of getting away from the grind of our everyday work lives. Finding time to re-energize is an important element to a healthy life. Vacations can be as varied as staying home and resting or filling every moment with something to do. Often, the planning of the vacation seems more positive than the actual experience. In my own experience, my vacations tend to be far more energizing when I maintain the elements of my everyday life, specifically my

connection with God and prayers. To confess, times in the past I have vacationed and have let slip my connection with God and the church. When I get back to my priestly ministry and life, I quickly realize why I was feeling empty rather than energized.

Jesus, too, needed to get away to re-energize. We know that when Jesus got away, it was to be alone and to be with his Father. This spiritual time away is also a necessary element to a healthy life. Aside from our regular prayer routine, we can make spiritual vacations known as retreats. This time away is specifically centered in spending time with God. ## Mary, the Model of good Stewardship María, modelo de buena corresponsabilidad

After Jesus, it is the Blessed Virgin Mary who by her example most perfectly teaches the meaning of discipleship and stewardship in their fullest sense. All of their essential elements are found in her life: she was called and gifted by God; she responded generously, creatively, and prudently; she understood her divinely assigned role as “handmaid” in terms of service and fidelity (see Lk 1:26-56). As Mother of God, her stewardship consisted of her maternal service and devotion to Jesus, from infancy to adulthood, up to the agonizing hours of Jesus’ death (Jn 19:25). As Mother of the Church, her stewardship is clearly articulated in the closing chapter of the Second Vatican Council’s Constitution on the Church, Lumen Gentium (cf. nos. 52-69). Pope John Paul II observes: “Mary is one of the first who ‘believed,’ and precisely with her faith as Spouse and Mother she wishes to act upon all those who entrust themselves to her as children” (Redemptoris Mater, no. 46). In light of all this, it only remains for all of us to ask ourselves this question: Do we also wish to be disciples of Jesus Christ? The Spirit is ready to show us the way—a way of which stewardship is a part.

Después de Jesús, la Santísima Virgen María es la que con su ejemplo nos enseña más claramente el significado completo de lo que es ser discípulo y cristiano corresponsable. Todos los elementos esenciales se pueden ver en su vida: ella fue llamada y bendecida por Dios; respondió generosamente, con creatividad y prudencia; comprendió el papel de “esclava” que Dios le dio en términos de servicio y fidelidad (ver Lc 1:26-56). Como Madre de Dios, su corresponsabilidad consistió en su servicio de madre a Jesús y su devoción hacia él, en su infancia, en su vida adulta y hasta en sus horas de agonía en la cruz (Jn 16:25). Como Madre de la Iglesia, su corresponsabilidad fue articulada claramente en el capítulo final del Concilio Vaticano II La Constitución dogmática sobre la Iglesia, Lumen Gentium (cf. 52-69). El Papa Juan Pablo II observa: “María es una de las primeras personas que creyó, y precisamente con su fe de Esposa y Madre ella desea ser mediadora de los que confían en ella como hijos” (Redemptoris Mater, 46). En vista de todo esto, sólo queda hacernos esta pregunta: ¿Deseamos también ser discípulos de Jesucristo? El Espíritu está listo a mostrarnos el camino — un camino del cual forma parte la corresponsabilidad.

*The Annunciation, the Immaculate Conception and the Incarnation.* Adam and Eve broke the first covenant and the unity between Heaven and earth when they gave in to their pride and disobeyed God. As a result, we are all born with Original Sin. God sent His only Son to repair our hearts by dying on the Cross for us, thereby replacing sin and death with new life. A woman would have a role to play, too. A woman's disobedience had brought sin and death into the world, and a very special woman's obedience would deliver the Savior. She is the Blessed Virgin Mary, the "new Eve." "But when the fullness of time had come, God sent His Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to ransom those under the law, so that we might receive adoption" (Galatians 4:4). The phrase "fullness of time," means that God's perfectly appointed time had arrived. God sent the angel Gabriel from Heaven. Gabriel appeared to a Jewish maiden named Mary and greeted her with the words, "Hail, favored one! The Lord is with you" (Luke 1:28). The first lines of the Hail Mary prayer come from this verse. "Mary said, 'Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her" (Luke 1:38). Created in the image of God with intellect, free will, and the capacity to love, Mary freely chose to respond to God's call to love.
