## STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today's readings exhort us Christian disciples to form ourselves — mind and heart — in imitation of Christ so we can better reflect His goodness in our daily lives.

The first reading from Sirach offers timeless counsel: "the fruit of a tree shows the care it has had: so too does one's speech disclose the bent of one's mind. Praise no one before he speaks." Jesus uses the very same analogy in today's Gospel reading from Luke: "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit."

Everything we have is a gift from God to be used for His honor and glory. This includes the gift of speech and, even more broadly, all forms of modern-day communication — email, text, Twitter, Facebook, and the rest. What comes forth from our mouths, or keyboard, or phone, reflects what is in our minds and hearts. Our ability to communicate with each other is itself a gift that we must steward well.

In the same Gospel passage, Jesus reminds us, "No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher." The more time we spend with Jesus, our teacher, through regular prayer and a strong sacramental life, the more we will become like Him. Then all that we do and say (and tweet and post) will bring others to closer Him. This is the life's work of the Christian steward. It is privileged work indeed.

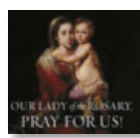

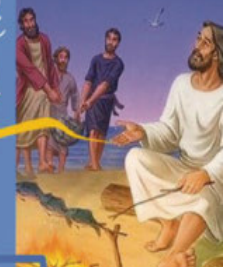

## A Glimpse of Spirituality (靈修一瞥) 12

Jesus is merciful. He always takes the initiative to approach the needy, in particular the sick and the dead, regardless their uncleanness. It is done not because of good mood but love. In a spiritual way, willing to help or pray for the enemies is to purify an intention to do good deed.

First, people contacted Jesus because he was approachable. The woman with a flow of blood for twelve years “had heard about Jesus, and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his garment.”

The preposition “about” (peri) of the phrase “heard about Jesus” (akousasa ta peri tou Iēsou) signifies that this woman had heard about Jesus’ mercy and love. The most important issue is that Jesus was approachable. Thus, in spite of the crowd, she tried her best effort to touch Jesus’ garments.

The verb “touch” (hēpsato) denotes grasping or persistence. That touch signifies the woman’s faith as she said: “If I touch even his garments, I shall be made well.” She did not demand Jesus to heal her personally but only wanted to touch Jesus’ garment for healing. As a result, Jesus said to her: “Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease.” Jesus welcomed the unclean to touch him in order that he made the unclean clean.

Afterwards, Jesus resurrected the synagogue ruler’s daughter. He went to her room: “taking her by the hand he said to her: Talitha cumi; which means: Little girl, I say to you, arise.”

Jesus indeed did not need to touch the corpse at all. As long as he said a word, the little girl could be brought back to life. However, since Jesus’s divinity integrated with human nature, he was willing to be with people.

“Taking up” (kratēsas) means to grasp or hold on to, which indicates Jesus’ insistence on human life. This action symbolizes that Jesus will not let go of people’s eternal life, even if he touched the unclean and the dead.

Either touching Jesus or being touched by Jesus; it manifests the mercy and love of God.

耶稣永远长存

耶稣慈悲，不是偶尔心情大好，就给人一点，而是他可以被接触，他也主动接触人，这些都是不洁的病人与死人。首先，人接触耶稣，因为他可以被接触，患血漏病十二年的妇人，听说有关“耶稣的传说，便来到人群中，从后边摸了耶稣的衣裳。”

“传说”在希腊版没有出现，只是简单的“听说有关耶稣” (akousasa ta peri tou Iēsou)，这“有关” (peri) 一定是他慈悲大爱，并且平易近人，因此挤在人群当中，摸了耶稣衣裳。

“摸” (hēpsato) 是抓住或接触，这表示妇人的信德：“因为她心里想：我只要一摸他的衣裳，必然会好的。”她没有苛求耶稣能够亲自治疗她，只想接触耶稣，就会获得痊愈。结果：“女儿，你的信德救了你，平安去罢！你的疾病必得痊愈！”耶稣欢迎不洁的人去接触他，然后，不洁成为清洁。

然后，耶稣复活会堂长的女儿；耶稣亲自到她房间：“他拿起小女孩的手，对她说：塔里塔，古木！意思是：女孩子，我命你起来！”

耶稣根本不需接触尸体，只要他说一句话，小女孩就可以起死回生；可是，耶稣既然以天主性取了人性，就跟人同甘共苦共死亡。

“拿起” (kratēsas) 意即抓住或坚持，表示耶稣对人命的坚持，以此象征耶稣不会放过人的永生而不顾，就算接触不洁死人，耶稣都以慈悲大爱。

接触耶稣，或耶稣接触的，都是慈悲大爱
