

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

After today's readings, we can't say we have not been warned about the dangers of mixed-up priorities. God's Word is so very clear today on the necessity of putting Him first in all areas of our lives.

We see this in the First Reading from Amos. The Lord has harsh words for those who would take advantage of the poor and whose priorities are not aligned with God's.

In the Second Reading from St. Paul's letter to Timothy, Paul gives us the antidote to the self-centeredness condemned in our First Reading. The antidote is to imitate Christ "who gave Himself as a ransom for all." Rather than thinking of Himself and how to "get ahead" Christ gave Himself away — completely — for our sake. That is how we are to live.

In our Gospel passage from Luke, the Lord shows us how to bridge the gap between worldly thinking and priorities and eternal thinking and priorities. Jesus tells the parable of the corrupt but clever steward who is about the get fired when the master discovers the steward has been squandering his property. Realizing his imminent unemployed status, the clever steward reaches out to the various debtors of his master to wheel and deal with them, making friends who would look out for him when he became jobless.

What if we put that kind of effort into our own tasks as good stewards of all God's gifts to us? Into our ministries, into the ways we could make more time for prayer as individuals, as couples, as families, and as a parish? What if we got as creative as the "bad steward" in the use of our finances so that we could give more generously to the poor and the advancement of God's kingdom on the earth?

That's our lesson and our challenge.

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PASTORS CORNER

This Sunday we continue with our annual Stewardship Renewal by having the opportunity to hear lay witness testimonies involving the stewardship way of life as well as attending the Ministry Fair in the lower level.

Our Gospel reading today also presents an important message about stewardship. First, we recognize that the idea of a steward does exist. Not everything we use or participate in is actually ours. In reality, the majority of our lives include many elements that belong to someone else. All the buildings, office spaces, stores, streets, churches, etc. are not our property. We may not consider ourselves responsible for all of these structures, but we do need to treat them with respect and not destroy them. In the world of the church, we ultimately realize that none of these things belong to us. All these buildings, the streets, the parks, the sky and oceans, our families and homes, everything belongs to the one true Master, our Heavenly Father. We are the stewards of what he has created, called to care for it and to be honest about it. The world and all it contains are not ours to do as we choose, but rather belong to the Father and Creator. We care for His world, producing the "fruit" to be given back to the one who "owns" it. This is why Jesus recognizes the need for his followers to disown what they think they have in order to truly be stewards of God's kingdom.

Today, Jesus reminds us that if we can care for the things of this world (dishonest wealth) we will be put in charge of the things that really matter (our heavenly reward). As we continue to pray about our lives as stewards of God's creation, we are challenged to re-evaluate how best to use our time, talents, and treasure.

I hope you enjoy hearing about the stewardship way of life from our parishioners today and find some important ways to share your time, talents, and treasure for the betterment of our cathedral and God's Kingdom.

Being a Good Steward for God Ser un Buen Mayordomo Jesus tells the story of a steward para Dios



Jesus tells the story of a steward who looked after a rich man's wealth. When he was about to lose his job, he quickly made friends by letting the rich man's debtors pay less than what they owed. Then when he couldn't

work anymore these friends would look after him.

One thing Jesus is telling us through this Parable is that we should use the money, our talents, and our time we have on Earth to make friends with God and the Saints so that they will be happy to take us into heaven when we die and have nothing left. How can you make friends with God using your money, your talents and your time? First of all God wants us to be good stewards. That means to use what we have as though it belongs to God (He gave us everything, right?). We can also be good Stewards and please God by doing well looking after small, everyday things (like chores and belongings) so that he can trust us with bigger things in the future, as we prepare one day to be with Him.

Una cosa que Jesús nos está diciendo a través de esta parábola es que debemos usar el dinero, nuestros talentos y nuestro tiempo que tenemos en la Tierra para hacernos amigos de Dios y de los santos para que estén felices de llevarnos al cielo cuando muramos y no me quede nada ¿Cómo puedes hacerte amigo de Dios usando tu dinero, tus talentos y tu tiempo? 

Glimpse of Spirituality (靈修一瞥) 40

It is so special that even one of the scribes came to Jesus, asking Jesus for becoming his disciple. He said: "Teacher, I will follow you wherever you go."

Jesus replied the scribe by illustrating the requirement of discipleship, i.e. the wandering life of Jesus: "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of man has nowhere to lay his head."

After hearing this, one of the disciples intended to leave Jesus by saying, "Lord, let me first go and bury my father." His father has not yet died. What he meant is that he would leave Jesus now and wait until his father passed away. Jesus insisted: "Follow me, and leave the dead to bury their own dead."

The verb "follow" (akolouthēsō) is meant that a person attending Jesus' life and accompanying him to the kingdom of heaven. That is to say, anyone who willingly follows Jesus, s/he must live the life of Jesus, i.e. the cross. This life is too hard to some disciples. They simply opt for their family life rather than Jesus' unstable life.

Jesus required that discipleship should take absolute precedence over everything else. Regarding the burial of parents, Jesus told the disciple to let the dead bury the dead. The meaning must be paradoxical and ironic that it denotes the spiritual death. So the buriers of the dead are those who have rejected Jesus and his calling. They loved parents more than Jesus (Matt 10:37) and had chosen death instead of the life eternal. In other words, the meaning of Jesus' statement should be "Let the living dead who are in the world bury those dead in the body."

The disciple is told by Jesus to let the dead bury their own dead. In this way the evangelist informs us that Jesus' mercy is not emotional. It is life, real life. Jesus freely bestows grace on his disciples but he is not to be presumed upon.

Love gives and requires in equal measure.

有經師來請求耶穌,要成為他的門徒,說: "師傅,你不論往那裡去,我要跟隨你。"

耶穌隨即說明成為門徒的條件,是跟他一起過居無定所的生活: "狐狸有穴,天上的飛鳥有巢,但是人子卻沒有枕頭的地方。"

聽這話,其中一個門徒打算離開耶穌,說: "主,請許我先去埋葬我的父親。"其實,他的父親還沒去世;只是暗示現在就離開耶穌,等他父親去世後,才來跟隨他。耶穌堅持說: "你跟隨我吧!任憑死人去埋葬他們的死人!" "跟隨"(akolouthēsō)意指參與耶穌生活,並跟隨他到天國。也就是說,任何願意跟隨耶穌的人,都必須過耶穌的生活,即十字架。十字架的生活,對一些門徒來說,太難了。他們還是選擇穩定生活,而非跟耶穌一樣居無定所。

耶穌培育門徒一切要以天主為先。關於父母葬禮,耶穌告訴門徒讓死人埋葬死人,這句話聽起來匪夷所思,耶穌意指屬靈的死亡。

"死人"指向那些拒絕耶穌和他召叫的人,從靈性生命的角度來看,他們已經死了;他們愛父母勝過愛耶穌(參瑪10:37),因此,實際上是選擇死亡而不是永生。這句話實際意思是"讓世上的活死人去埋葬他們的死人"。耶穌這句神修話,告訴信徒他的慈悲不是一時感動,是生活,真實的生活。

耶穌的慈悲大愛,邀請門徒回應,是愛的圓滿,是活人。

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
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
