

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today's readings remind us of a chief virtue that characterizes the Christian steward: humility. This is a virtue that is widely thought of as a form of self-abasement. That understanding, however, is off the mark. Humility is simply the awareness of who (and Whose) we truly are.

On one hand, we are children of the Most High God who loved us into existence and who, by virtue of our Baptism, have the Holy Trinity dwelling within us. On the other hand, we are children who are completely dependent on God for our existence and for every breath we take.

Our Lord speaks of true humility in our Gospel passage from Luke, telling the parable of the guests invited to a wedding banquet and instructing us not to seek a place of honor at the banquet table, lest a more distinguished guest arrives and we are asked to move to a lower place.

Jesus has much more in mind here than an etiquette lesson. He is reminding us that all glory belongs to God. The visual image He offers in having to slink down to a lower seat at the table points out how silly we are when we forget to give God the credit for our blessings and talents.

On the other hand, when we live in humility — recognizing that all we have is a gift from God and using those gifts to serve Him and others — then God "exalts" us by filling us with even more of Himself and His grace.

Jesus goes on to encourage us to serve and share our blessings with people facing circumstances that would make it impossible for them to offer us any worldly advantage or prestige — "the poor, the crippled, the lame."

Our attitude and how we serve and share should be centered on true humility — recognizing that we are all "little" ones in the eyes of God. We are all His children; brothers and sisters invited to our Father's heavenly banquet.

The Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament is a stewardship parish. This means that we are committed to assisting our parishioners to live as Christian stewards in grateful response to the gifts God has given us. God is the great gift-giver, and we need to thank Him, for without Him we have nothing. Our gratitude to God is the foundation of living a stewardship way of life.

As we continue our stewardship journey, let's refresh ourselves of the stewardship basics.

What is stewardship?

Stewardship is the grateful response of a Christian disciple who recognizes and receives God's gifts and shares these gifts in love of God and neighbor. The U.S. Bishops' Pastoral Letter on Stewardship states "As Christian stewards, we receive God's gifts gratefully, cultivate them responsibly, share them lovingly in justice with others, and return them with increase to the Lord."

Three "T's" of Stewardship— Time, Talent, & Treasure

Stewardship of Time: Using my time on earth wisely; making time for personal prayer, family prayer and quality time with friends and loved ones.

Stewardship of Talent: Using my God-given abilities to strengthen the Church and help others, especially through parish ministries and activities.

Stewardship of Treasure: The wise and just management of my financial resources; giving an appropriate amount of my income to the parish.

Prayer - A Heart-to-Heart with God

Every great saint has taught that prayer is the most essential component in the life of the Christian. Through prayer, we nurture our most important relationship — the one that will last for all eternity.

Formation - Continuous Conversion

From childhood through adulthood, our whole life must be a process of drawing closer to God. He never stops calling us forward to learn more and to examine ourselves more deeply.

Service - Love in Action

"Amen I say to you, whatever you did to the least of my brothers, you did it to me" (Matthew 25:40). While we may not view ourselves as saints, we too are called to such heroic service within our own community.

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

People who are concerned with their own advancement and agenda have little room for anyone else. With an almost addictive pursuit of esteem and acknowledgment from others, they become little more than entitled embodiments of the vice of pride. Public humiliation or embarrassment can hit them hard. While avoiding humiliation and embarrassment may be advantageous

to obtaining worldly success, they are much less desirable motivations for entering the Kingdom of God. Avoiding embarrassment is a self-serving motivation. Pride and all of its manifestations have no place on God's agenda, neither do worldly success and fulfillment. In fact, we have been clearly told that if we love our lives, we will lose them. Therefore, if you really want to find your true station in life, learn to give yourself away.

While this may sound foolish to secular ears, it actually makes perfect sense. God, who is love, makes each of us in His image. Love, and therefore God, is in our DNA. That being the case, love is never love if it is kept to oneself or hoarded. Love needs to be shared and given away. Therefore, it is the only proper motivation for entering the Kingdom of God. The door to happiness is only opened when we realize that all we are and all we have is due only to God's grace. Without God we are nothing.

Love is the remedy for pride and protects us from ourselves. God asks us to be humble. Only when we are free from the traps of pride and arrogance that we can begin to follow the path to true humility. Only one who is humble can rightly love and be of service to God. "God makes use only of the humble as his instruments (Jean-Pierre de Caussade)." The humble one does not need others to give them worth and value. Their self-esteem comes from the much more secure foundation of God. Only those who are entirely free can give themselves freely to others. Love must always be our motivation for doing all things. Be content that God has invited you to the banquet of life. Concern yourself with accepting the invitation, and don't worry about where you will sit.



A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥37





In addition to the birth of the Son of God, the mother of Jesus was entrusted to be the mother of the church before Jesus died. Mary went through labor pain again because under the cross, she gave birth to the church as her child. This labor pain is far beyond the moment when Jesus was born because the world rejected Jesus and even crucified him. The heart of Mary ached. However, the tragic death of Jesus was not the main cause of pain. For Mary, nothing is more painful than seeing the beloved children of God burying them in the hell. This second birth pain of Mary manifests that she was willing to give birth to the church by obeying Jesus' calling.

Jesus said to his mother: "Woman, behold, your son!" Jesus then said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" Jesus did not say, "Behold, your woman" because this woman is the one who is called by God as to collaborate with Jesus in the salvation plan: "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her seed." (Gen 3:15), her work is to be the mother of God and also the mother of the church.

"Woman" is Mary's vocation, and "Mother" is her work.

The beloved disciple completely accepted Jesus' entrustment, just like Jesus' mother, without saying a word and he "took her to his own home." "The home" (ta idia, the own) literally means belonging to an individual, one's own family, home, or property. Here it is understood as the place of the disciple. The evangelist used "the own" that in Greek is "ta idia" as to replace "home" (oikos), indicating that Mary was accepted to the life of the disciple. As a result, the church was established by Mary and this beloved disciple under the cross.

Mary takes care of the church as she nurtured Jesus. Thus, she will nourish the church with her spiritual milk, i.e. faith, hope, and love.

When Christians preach the gospel and serve the church, like the mother of Jesus, they give birth to Jesus into the world.

耶穌說過: "婦女生產的時候,感到憂苦,因為她的時辰來到了;既生了孩子,因了喜樂再不記憶那苦楚了,因為一個 人已生在世上了。"(若16:21)

聖母除了誕生天主子耶穌,還有,她在耶穌臨死之前,被交託作為教會之母。

聖母又再次經歷產痛,因為,在十字架下,她生產教會這個孩子

這一次產痛,遠超誕生耶穌的時刻,因為世界拒絕耶穌,甚至要釘死他,聖母心痛,除了耶穌的慘死,更重要的,有很 多天主疼愛的孩子, 狂奔地獄。

聖母第二次產痛, 是她甘願承擔誕生教會的痛苦。

耶穌對聖母說: "女人,看,你的兒子!"耶穌然後對愛徒說: "看,你的母親!"耶穌沒說: "看,你的女人!"因 為,這位在救恩工程當中,被天主召叫的"女人":"我要把仇恨放在你和女人,你的後裔和她的後裔之間。。。" (創3:15),她的任務是作天主之母,以及教會之母。

"女人"是聖母的聖召, "母親"是她的工作。

愛徒完全接受耶穌的交託,沒說半句話,如同聖母一樣,欣然"把她接到自己家裡"。

"家裡"(ta idia, the own)直譯是屬於個人的、自己家人、家或財產;這裡解作門徒的地方,聖史沒有用"房子" (oikos) 而用了"ta idia",表示親切關係,因此,聖母與愛徒,在十字架下,一起就被耶穌召叫建立教會。

聖母照顧教會,如同哺育耶穌長大。聖母將用屬靈的奶,即她對耶穌的信德、望德以及愛德,滋養教會成長。

當基督徒傳揚福音以及服務教會,如同聖母一樣,將耶穌與教會誕生世上
