

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today's Gospel passage comes as a pat on the back from Heaven for all of us striving to live a stewardship way of life. It reminds us why we live the way we do and why we make the choices we make. Let's face it, if we truly embrace this way of life, there will be people who find our choices — based on serving God and others — downright foolish. But let's see what God thinks. Spoiler alert: turns out Christian stewards are not the fools!

In this passage, Jesus makes it clear that life is not about "stuff" as he tells the parable of the wealthy businessman who thought he had everything figured out. The man had such an abundance of stuff that he didn't have room to store it all. So, thinking of earthly things and not on what is above, he decided to build a bigger place to store all that stuff. Patting himself on the back, he thought about what good times he would have in the years ahead. But Jesus tells us that day would turn out to be the man's last day on the earth. And he had spent it thinking only of himself. How foolish!

Don't be ashamed of living differently from the people around you. Be confident as you set priorities based on what is above. You are wise in God's eyes, Christian steward. And you will be rich in what matters most.



On June 19th of this year, the Catholic dioceses of the United States began a three-year Eucharistic Revival. In an effort to increase awareness and knowledge about what we teach and believe about the Eucharist, the hope is that those


who don't believe or understand the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist will gain a deeper understanding and appreciation of the sacrament. This will be an exciting endeavor throughout our own Diocese of Sacramento in which the beauty and transforming love of the Eucharist is rightfully outshining all other "issues" of the church and world.

Understanding the mystery of the sacrament of the Eucharist makes this revival somewhat complicated. It's clear that the bishops of the U.S. want to emphasize that the Real Presence of Jesus the Christ is present in the species of bread and wine, a Eucharistic Revival will embrace a much larger and greater understanding of this mystery. None of us fully comprehend the beauty and love that invites us into the Eucharistic banquet, so as Church we realize that even though we profess the truth of the Real Presence, we as believers very seldom live out the

mystery of this truth. This is something we accept, after all we are talking about mystery. It can, however, look to some people both within the church and outside of it, that this mystery is rather a myth and therefore, doubt or deny the truth of it. We who do believe are always challenged to live out the Real Presence of Jesus by living holy lives that will help transform and make believers of all people.

We do believe that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. This change is not simply about the transubstantiation of bread and wine into His body and blood, but about the transubstantiation of His entire flock (the Church) into His body and blood. A Eucharistic Revival necessarily moves us beyond teachings to living out the truths of these mysteries. The teaching and understanding of the Real Presence must be lived out in real life. The gift of the Eucharist in which we are invited to share in the gratitude of the Son's pure love offered to the Father, and the Father's pure love accepting that offering, must always transform our lives, the life of the Church, and the life of the world. Our three-year Eucharistic Revival is truly about reviving our lives, an endeavor which extends beyond our own lifespans, and which requires a lot more space and knowledge than my little pastor's corner can afford. God bless you all.

El 19 de junio de este año, las diócesis católicas de los Estados Unidos comenzaron un avivamiento eucarístico de tres años. En un esfuerzo por aumentar la conciencia y el conocimiento sobre lo que enseñamos y creemos sobre la Eucaristía, la esperanza es que aquellos que no creen o no entienden la Presencia Real de Cristo en la Eucaristía obtengan una comprensión y apreciación más profundas del Sacramento. Este será un esfuerzo emocionante en toda nuestra propia Diócesis de Sacramento en el que la belleza y el amor transformador de la Eucaristía está eclipsando legítimamente todos los demás "problemas" de la iglesia y el mundo.

Comprender el misterio del sacramento de la Eucaristía hace que este avivamiento sea algo complicado. Está claro que los obispos de los Estados Unidos quieren enfatizar que la Presencia Real de Jesús el Cristo está presente en las especies de pan y vino, un Avivamiento Eucarístico abrazará una comprensión mucho más y más grande de este misterio. Ninguno de nosotros comprende plenamente la belleza y el amor que nos invita al banquete eucarístico, por lo que como Iglesia nos damos cuenta de que, aunque profesamos la verdad de la Presencia Real, nosotros, como creyentes, muy rara vez vivimos el misterio de esta verdad. Esto es algo que aceptamos, después de todo estamos

hablando de misterio. Puede, sin embargo, mirar a algunas personas, tanto dentro de la iglesia como fuera de ella, que este misterio es más bien un mito y, por lo tanto, duda o niega la verdad del mismo. Nosotros, los que creemos, siempre tenemos el desafío de vivir la Presencia Real de Jesús viviendo vidas santas que ayudarán a transformar y hacer creyentes a todas las personas.

Creemos que Jesús está verdaderamente presente en la Eucaristía. Este cambio no se trata simplemente de la transubstanciación del pan y el vino en Su cuerpo y sangre, sino de la transubstanciación de todo Su rebaño (la Iglesia) en Su cuerpo y sangre. Un Avivamiento Eucarístico necesariamente nos mueve más allá de las enseñanzas para vivir las verdades de estos misterios. La enseñanza y la comprensión de la Presencia Real deben ser vividas en la vida real. El don de la Eucaristía en la que estamos invitados a compartir la gratitud del amor puro del Hijo ofrecido al Padre, y el amor puro del Padre aceptando esa ofrenda, debe transformar siempre nuestras vidas, la vida de la Iglesia y la vida del mundo. Nuestro Avivamiento Eucarístico de tres años se trata verdaderamente de revivir nuestras vidas, un esfuerzo que se extiende más allá de nuestra propia esperanza de vida, y que requiere mucho más espacio y conocimiento de lo que el rincón de mi pequeño pastor puede permitirse. Dios los bendiga a todos.

Stewardship Focus

Joshua's House Volunteer Hospice is designed as a community-based adult group home that will offer comfort care, shelter, clothing, and meals to terminally ill, homeless men and women transferred from local health systems. Quality hospice care will then be provided by local non-profit hospice providers from Dignity Health, Sutter Health, Kaiser Permanente, UC Davis Home Health Care & Hospice Program, and Yolo Hospice. There will be no cost to residents, their families, or insurance providers.

Joshua's House will be located on City-owned property at 3630 Larchwood Drive, Sacramento, CA 95834. The one-acre property has been leased for 25 years and renewable for another 25 years at no rent. Joshua's House will pay property taxes. The site will have six ADA-compliant manufactured homes that will house 15 residents initially with room to add three more homes allowing for a total of 24 residents.

Educational opportunities will include practicums and internships for medical, nursing, and social work students to learn more about the homeless population, end-of-life issues, and hospice care. In addition, trained and certified volunteers will serve as End-of-Life Doulas while other volunteers will be trained in hospice care and assist in caring for residents along with the appropriate staff.

We are raising funds now to build the foundations, do the paving and landscaping, and connect utilities. We welcome donations and, once we open, we welcome folks who would like to volunteer! Please contact Marlene Fitzwater at m.fitzwater@thehcri.org for more information.

Jesus teaches us not to be greedy

In today's Gospel reading, a man tells Jesus that his brother is being unfair to him. But Jesus knows that the man is just being greedy, so He tells him the

parable of the rich farmer. One year he had such a good harvest that he couldn't fit it all into his barns. He tore down his old barns and built new ones, so that he could store his food for many years. But just when he thought he would be able to rest and enjoy his food, God told him that he would die.

This parable is a warning against being greedy. Jesus is not saying that we should not save some food or that we shouldn't save our money. He is just telling us to remember that we are going to die one day, and then everything we saved is going to be useless for us. He wants us to use the things we have wisely, but not be too attached to them.

Think of something that is really special to you. How would you feel if you lost it or it was taken away? Do your feelings show that you care too much about things? Try to think of your belongings in such a way that if you lost them you wouldn't be too upset. After all, none of your stuff is going to matter to you when you die!

Tesús nos enseña no ser codiciosos.

En la lectura del Evangelio de hoy, un hombre le dice a Jesús que su hermano está siendo injusto con él. Pero Jesús sabe que el hombre solo está siendo codicioso, así que le cuenta la parábola del granjero rico. Un año tuvo una cosecha tan buena que no pudo meterla toda en sus graneros. Derribó sus viejos graneros y construyó otros nuevos, para poder almacenar su comida durante muchos años. Pero justo cuando pensó que estaría seguro para descansar y disfrutar de su comida, Dios le dijo que moriría.

Esta parábola es una advertencia contra la avaricia. Jesús no está diciendo que no deberíamos tener algo de comida o que no deberíamos ahorrar nuestro dinero. Él simplemente nos está diciendo que recordemos que vamos a morir un día, y entonces todo lo que ahorremos no nos servirá de nada. Él quiere que usemos sabiamente las cosas que tenemos, pero que no nos apeguemos demasiado a ellas.

Piensa en algo que sea realmente especial para ti. ¿Cómo te sentirías si lo perdieras o te lo quitaran? ¿Tus sentimientos muestran que te preocupas demasiado por las cosas? Trate de pensar en sus pertenencias de tal manera que si las pierde no se enfade demasiado. ¡Después de todo, ninguna de tus cosas te importará cuando mueras!





A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥33

The world emphasizes class. Sometimes the church is also polluted that it only focuses on who is superior and who is inferior. To put it bluntly, they all obey the authority, and even more so, worship of the power.

This is the good news from Jesus, "No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you."

As a matter of fact, sinners are not even worthy of being God's slaves because God has thousands of angels. However, through his incarnation, death, and resurrection, Jesus manifests to the world his perfect revelation of love. The noun "servants" (doulos) can be interpreted as slaves. Jesus did not command the disciples to do this and that. He just became the friend of the sinners.

"Friends" (philous) here means collaborators. Jesus invited sinners to be his partners for building up the kingdom of heaven. Thus, the relationship between Jesus and his disciples is like sisters and brothers. People can see a circle of community that Jesus is one dot of the circumference, not even the center of the circle. There is no distinction between high and low because the kingdom of heaven is the perfect oneness.

Being a collaborator of Jesus' salvation, one must follow Jesus as to love the heavenly Father and obey the command of love. The greatest message that the heavenly Father has revealed to the world in Jesus is that God loves all humans: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16)

How do Christians cooperate with Jesus sincerely?

Jesus said, "You should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide."

The Greek verb "abide" (menē) denotes that the disciples should bear the fruit of the great love, i.e. remaining in Jesus. This fruit is the testimony of the believers to the Father. Moreover, like Jesus, the testimony is the glorification of the Father.

Jesus took his death and resurrection as to reveal the glory of the Father's love. Thus, the fruit of the disciples is their love for each other so that the world will see the glory of the Father.

Love lights up the darkness of the world and opens the eyes of people to see the glory of God.

"僕人"(doulos)可以解作奴隸,耶穌沒有高高在上命令門徒去做這做那,他成為罪人的朋友。

"朋友"(philous)這裡意指合作者,耶穌邀請罪人做他天國合夥人,關係如兄弟姊妹,沒有高低之分,因為天國就是完美的"一"。

要做耶穌救贖工程的合作者,就要跟隨耶穌去愛天父,聽從天父愛的命令,這就是天父在耶穌內向世界啟示的最大喜訊-天主愛人: "天主竟這樣愛了世界,甚至賜下了自己的獨生子,使凡信他的人不至喪亡,反而獲得永生。" (若3:16)

如何跟耶穌衷誠合作?

耶穌說: "去結常存的果實。"

"常存"(menē)按照希臘本是"留在"(remain, abide),門徒要結出留在耶穌大愛的果實,這果實是信徒的作證,作證如耶穌一樣,是光榮天父。耶穌以他的死亡復活去啟示天父愛的光榮,門徒的果實,也就是他們的彼此相愛,讓世界看到天父的光榮。


