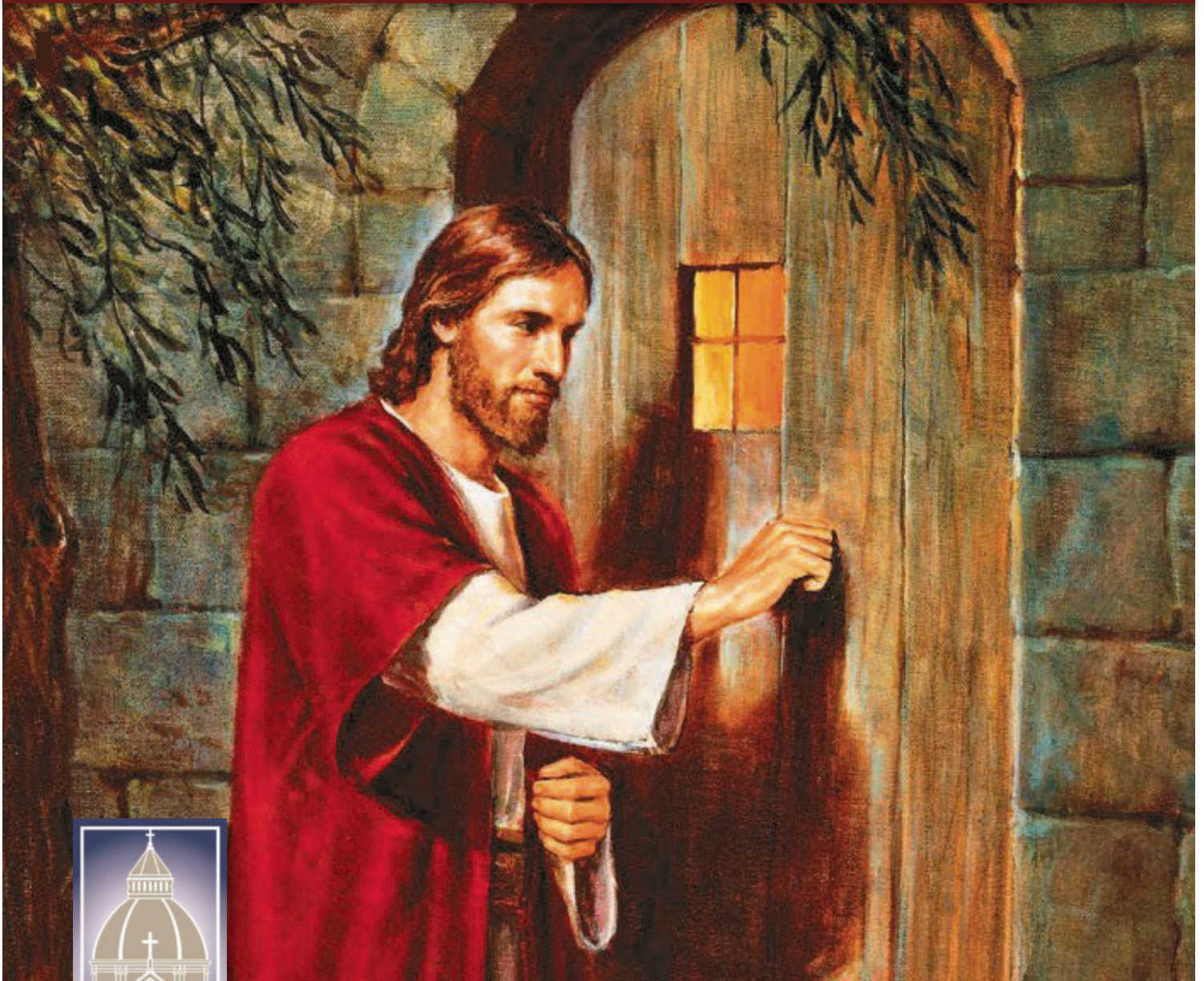

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Whether you are just beginning your stewardship journey or have been living a stewardship way of life for years, today's readings invite us to ask ourselves an important question to ponder.

The question is this: "What do you treasure?" Of course, we all know the "right" answer: we treasure our faith, our family, and our friendships. But Jesus tells us in the Gospel passage from Luke how we can discover the real answer to this question. He says, "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be."

To discern what we really treasure, we need to do a check on our hearts. We can each ask ourselves, "Where do I spend the majority of my energy? Where do I find my thoughts dwelling? How do I choose to spend my time when I find myself with a few spare moments? What do my spending habits reveal about my what is important to me?"

As Christian stewards, we are called to live our lives in grateful response to all that God has given us. Do I recognize and treasure these gifts?

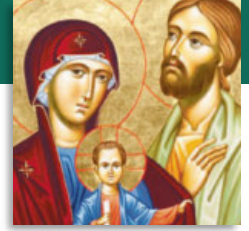

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

St. Thomas Aquinas reminds us that, “Three things are necessary for the salvation of man: to know what he ought to believe, to know what he ought to desire, and to know what he ought to do.” Everyone is called to work toward their salvation, which is ultimately union with God. Those who take this call seriously must embark upon a journey inward to the deepest recesses of their soul. In the adventure and wonder of that journey, we work out the details of our union with our Beloved. We cling to what we need to believe, remain firm in what we truly desire, and are guided by what we know we have to do. Once we know that our goal is to be one with our Creator, life becomes an exciting expedition to pursue that end. We make necessary preparations, follow the map, and remain on course.

Whenever we really want something, we put our entire selves into achieving it. Being fully invested in our labor, we willingly work extra hours, devote an abundance of energy and effort, and remain vigilant for beneficial opportunities that may come our way. We certainly do not passively sit by doing nothing! Such an attitude leads to laziness and the accomplishment of little. Worse yet, some look to others to do the work for them, hoping to reap the benefits of another’s efforts. Conscientiousness and diligence are the only means to success.

For the one who eagerly awaits the day when they can be fully with God, life becomes a joyous adventure indeed! Alert, ready, focused, convicted, and willing to be a servant they constantly watch and prepare themselves for meeting the Lord. Loving the journey and being in love with their Creator, their lives become joyful witnesses of love and service. They are secure in their hope, confident in their faith, and perfect in their love. Never looking for recognition or gratitude, they stand as gentle inspirations of what the Holy Spirit can do in the hearts of those who believe. Because we do not know what tomorrow will bring, we stand ready to be used as God wills and run eagerly toward Him when He comes. How much do we desire to experience the joy of salvation?

La Palabra de Dios sigue dándonos las pistas seguras para saber repartir los bienes que tenemos, y nos invita a poner nuestro corazón en diferente dirección. La clave es estar preparados para no ser sorprendidos sin haber completado la labor encomendada por Dios. “Tengan puesta la ropa de trabajo y sus lámparas encendidas. A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥34

Jesus never promised that the church would be popular or smooth in the world. He said, “Truly, truly, I say to you, you will weep and lament, but the world will rejoice; you will be sorrowful, but your sorrow will turn into joy.”

When Christians enter the world for evangelization, they do not only recite the rosaries and then ascend to heaven alone. They, actually, bring the kingdom of heaven to the world. When preaching the gospel encounters those who reject God, Christians will naturally be rejected or even persecuted by them.

When the world believes that they have defeated the church, it is exactly the same time that they are utterly defeated.

When the church suffers, Jesus indicated that the world will rejoice. The verb “rejoice” (charēsetai) is the expression of joy for others. However, the world now rejoices for the pain of the church, this negative joy is indeed psychologically perverted.

The church’s weeping (klausetete) and wailing (thrēnēsete) are all expressions of painful emotions. However, pain here is the life situation of insisting on faith and bearing witness to the Lord. If the church joins the world, there will be no pain but only false joy.

Jesus went on to explain that the disciples would be sorrowful (lypēthēsesthe). This emotion of grief does not come from the world’s misunderstanding, but they see that the sinful world is leaving God. From spiritual perspective, the persecuted people grieve only because the wicked lose their salvation, not because they are hurt. They are convinced that persecution is followed by eternal life. In other words, pain is the prelude to eternal joy.

Jesus said, “Your sorrow will turn into joy.” There are two kinds of sorrows, and likewise joys, one is temporary and the other is eternal. The joy of the world is temporary and perverted; its pain is forever and ever. The pain of the church is short-lived but a testimony; the joy of the church is eternal in the kingdom of heaven.

Suffering for love is far better than rejoicing for hatred.

耶穌從來沒有應許教會在世界普受歡迎，或順風順水

耶穌說：“你們要痛哭，哀號，世界卻要歡樂；你們將要憂愁，但你們的憂愁卻要變為喜樂。”

基督徒入世福傳，不是獨善其身念經升天；而是將天國帶到人間。當傳揚福音遇到拒絕天主的人，基督徒，自然也會被他們抗拒或甚至迫害。

世界以為自己打敗教會的時候，也就是他們徹底失敗之時，因地獄

當教會痛苦的時候，耶穌說明世界會歡樂。

“歡樂” (charēsetai) 是對於他人表示喜樂，現在，世界是為了教會的痛苦而喜樂，這負面喜樂，是幸災樂禍；簡言之，心理變態。

而教會的痛哭 (klausetete) 與哀號 (thrēnēsete)，都是痛苦情緒表達，不過，痛苦在這裡，是堅持信仰以及為主作證的生命狀況，如果教會跟世界同流合污，絕對不會痛苦，只有虛假喜樂。

耶穌繼續說明，門徒會憂愁，“憂愁” (lypēthēsesthe) 是陷入悲傷情緒，悲傷源頭不是因為世界誤解教會，而是為罪惡世界離開天主，悲傷。

從神修角度，被迫害的人，悲傷只是為了惡人失去救恩，不是為了自己受到傷害。他們深信，迫害之後是永生，換言之，痛苦是永恆喜樂的前奏。

耶穌說：“你們的憂愁卻要變為喜樂。” 憂愁分兩類，同樣，喜樂一樣，一是暫時，一是永恆。世界的喜樂，短暫而且變態；世界的痛苦，永遠以及永遠。教會的痛苦，短暫可是作證；教會的喜樂，永恆活在天國。

為愛而受苦，遠超為恨而喜樂
