

#### STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today's readings make very clear the demands that will be made of those wanting to be called disciples of Christ. We must be prepared to give our all to Him. But in the end, the life of discipleship — the stewardship way of life — is the only life that can truly satisfy.

In the Gospel passage from Luke, Christ says, "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." Our Lord is speaking here not of emotions but rather of priorities. He must come first in all aspects of our lives. Period.

He goes on. "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." In other words, it's all or nothing. Compromise is simply not possible. Christ wants us to give all of ourselves, all aspects of our individual lives, our family life, our parish over to Him and to the pursuit of His kingdom.

And just when we think our Lord might soften His message to make it a little more palatable, He goes further! "Anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple." Why is our Lord being so demanding? Only because He knows us so well and loves us so much.

He knows that if we do not live by putting Him first before all else, we will easily be swallowed up by the earthly cares that weigh us down — our material things, our status, and our egos. He knows these things cannot satisfy us. He knows this because He is our Maker, and He made us for more.

We are made to be His disciples, to seek after Him and His Kingdom. Embracing stewardship as a way life allows us to count the cost, and then run after Him with all our might.


## What is stewardship?

# NEW CATHEDRAL PIPE ORGAN

Last August, I received an inquiry as to whether the Cathedral would be open to receiving a donation of a pipe organ. This organ was property of Chico State University and was built in the late 80s. If you are familiar with the University, this pipe organ sat in Harlen Adams Theatre. It was commissioned by the

University in commemoration of the school's one hundredth anniversary and was named the "Centennial Organ." One of the foremost organ builders living today, Munetaka Yokota, started building the organ in 1984, and it was completed in 1990.

In July 2020, Chico State put the organ up for auction. The "Centennial Organ Committee," a group dedicated to preserving the organ and keeping it in Northern California, combined its resources, and the Committee submitted the winning bid. The pipe organ was disassembled in August 2020 and placed in storage until a new home could be found for the organ.

I was approached last year by the Committee about placing the organ in the Cathedral. After much discernment, with the enthusiastic support of Fr. O'Reilly, and after receiving the blessings of Bishops Soto and Weigand, the Cathedral received the pipe organ on July 11 & 12. The Centennial Organ currently sits in pieces in the Manogue Building awaiting its rebirth as the primary liturgical instrument for the Cathedral.

#### What makes this organ so special?

- 1. The organ was built using historical principles.
  - a. It is a mechanical action organ, and thus, does not need electricity to be played.
  - b. The organ was modeled after pipe organs J.S. Bach would have known and played. Thus, this organ artistically renders the vast opus of music composed for the pipe organ.

- 2. The organ is a "green" organ: the carbon footprint is very low as locally sourced materials were used in building the organ.
  - a. The University Farm donated shin bones from cows to fashion the keyboards.
  - b. The University art department created the organ pipes from reclaimed tin and lead.
  - c. Local lumber companies contributed wood. In addition, wood from the historic Hooker Oak tree, which lived in Bidwell Park and fell in 1977, was used to create the pedalboard and bench.
- 3. University students and local Chico volunteers learned organbuilding techniques from Mr. Yokota and assisted him in building the Centennial Organ.

The Centennial Organ is about the same physical size as our current organ, but it contains twice as many pipes. The organ was never finished according to the original plan, and the goal is to complete the organ. If completed, the Centennial Organ will contain about 3000 pipes; our current pipe organ has 1200 pipes.

The Cathedral is working with the Diocese to devise a plan for this organ project, which includes dismantling and selling the current organ, rebuilding the Centennial Organ, placing it in the south transept, making appropriate repairs, and expanding the organ to realize its original concept. When this is all said and done, the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament will have a world-class pipe organ. It will be a work of beauty. . .a true work of art for the eyes and ears!

I will keep you updated as details of this organ project emerge, and I will let you know how you can be a part of this effort. As Bishop Weigand wrote to me, rebuilding the Centennial Organ for the Cathedral "would complete the most notable aspect of the cathedral restoration that we were not able to accomplish during the 2003-2005 phase." I welcome any comments or questions you may have about this exciting new project for our Cathedral.

# GOSPEL MEDITATION/MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

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#### ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

What virtue is the cornerstone of discipleship? Love. Jesus preached about it, lived it, and summarized his greatest commandment featuring it. Love is in our DNA. To follow Jesus, then, is to follow the path of love. While this may appear to be an attractive and easy option, it most assuredly is not. Authentic love always comes with sacrifice. It is the complete giving of oneself to another. The sacrificial character of love always requires that we leave something aside and pursue something else. This is at the heart of self-denial. Love asks us to make choices that are often difficult.

There is a reason Jesus asks that the love of God come first. "Charity is the right attitude of mind which prefers nothing to the knowledge of God. If a man possesses any strong attachment to the things of this earth, he cannot possess true charity (St. Maximus the Confessor)." "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." A devoted disciple must be single-minded in her quest for God. She cannot allow anyone or anything to have more power over her soul than God. When any earthly attachments become more important than Love, we can get ourselves into trouble.

The Gospel calls us to walk boldly into the darkness, confusion, and emptiness of the world clothed in the mantle of love. We are asked to walk with others on their journey, offering a supportive, healing, challenging, and faithful presence. Ours is not to judge. To walk this sacrificial journey means that I must put myself aside and focus on the needs of others. "A sacrifice to be real must cost, must hurt and must empty ourselves (St. Teresa of Calcutta)." Love helps us walk straight and focus to see things more clearly and help others to do so as well. Many folks struggle to find joy and meaning in life. People may simply need someone with the freedom to sit with them in their pain, so they don't feel so alone. Through acts of kindness, gestures of acceptance, and words of compassion, burdens can be lightened. Believe in God's love and seek it above all other things!

#### ALENTAR UN ENTENDIMIENTO MÁS PROFUNDO DE LA ESCRITURA

Lo principal es dejar caprichos, egoísmos y malos sentimientos hacia otras personas. De esto trata el Evangelio de hoy. Trata de calcular y cargar y dejar todo lo que impida seguir a Jesús, como sus fieles discípulos: "El que no carga con su propia cruz para seguirme luego, no puede ser discípulo mío" (Lucas 14,27).

"El seguimiento de Jesús es un compromiso serio y al mismo tiempo gozoso; requiere de radicalidad y esfuerzo para reconocer al divino Maestro en los más pobres y descartados de la vida y ponerse a su servicio. Por esto los voluntarios que sirven a los últimos y a los necesitados por amor a Jesús no esperan ningún agradecimiento ni gratificación, sino que renuncian a todo esto porque han descubierto el verdadero amor" (Papa Francisco). Señor, ayúdanos con tu gracia a conseguir el cambio de vida tan deseado, porque sin ti, sin tu amor, no somos nada ni llegamos a nada. Por esa razón la primera lectura nos dice: "¿Quién, en realidad, podría conocer la voluntad del Señor? ¿Quién se apasionará por lo que quiere el Señor? (Sabiduría 9,13). No podemos seguir al Señor a ciegas, la fortaleza llega con la oración y las buenas obras.



#### Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥38

Jesus wishes true peace for all Christians. True peace is not meticulous care for every moment or all prayers are answered immediately. For instance, some Christians usually pray that way: if going out for a picnic, they will pray for sunshine. Then Jesus sheds them sunshine within one second. However, the farmer wants to water the fields by asking God for rain. Jesus sends forth the rain to the farmer but the picnic goer sends God complaints at once. Finally, Jesus gives the world sunshine again.

What ridiculous and childish prayers are!

True peace is not the calm after the storm; to the contrast, it should be the calm in the midst of life's ups and downs. Therefore, in the face of persecution and suffering, there is no need to reason with the persecutors, because they turn their ears off. The persecution to Jesus from the false religious leaders is a good example demonstrating their ignorance of Jesus' miracles made and good news proclaimed. Their hearts were hardened and finally, they crucified Jesus.

If any persons entangled with the persecutors, as a matter of fact, in addition to being caught in their tricks, i.e. playing mud wrestling with them and going to hell together, even the peace that Jesus gives will be swept away by one's own stupidity.

Jesus said, "Do not resist one who is evil. But if any one strikes you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also."

The verb "resist" (antistēnai) means to oppose or refuse to bear. The "one who is evil" (tō ponērō) points to those who are morally corrupted. If Christians deal with the evil by using violence to fight with them, they are just like the wicked ones, i.e. violence fighting with violence. This is not the way of Jesus.

Jesus asked Christians not to fight. It does not mean cowardice. Just as Jesus was crucified, it was not that he was incapable of saving himself, but that he proclaimed God's mercy and love with forgiveness. The preaching of the cross is much more powerful than any beautiful preaching.

The real peace lies in this: God is in human's heart even life is in the stormy sea.

With God, the boat of heart will sail to the kingdom of heaven, finally.

耶穌說: "不要抵抗惡人;而且,若有人掌擊你的右頰,你把另一面也轉給他。"

"抵抗" (antistēnai) 意即反對、拒絕承受或反抗。 "惡人" (tō ponērō, the evil one) 是那些倫理道德敗壞的人,如果與惡人周旋,還用他們的暴力方法加以對抗,就如他們一樣,以暴易暴,這非耶穌道路。

耶穌要基督徒不要對抗,不等同懦弱,如同耶穌被人釘死,不是他無能拯救自己,而是他以寬恕宣揚天主慈悲大愛,十字架的宣講,比任何漂亮講道,都來得有力。

真正平安就在於此,心中有主,人生在狂風巨浪當中,航行到天國

#### HOLY EUCHARIST
