## STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today we reach the finale of the Easter season with the celebration of the great Feast of Pentecost. Reflecting on today's readings inspires a sense of awe as we consider the mighty power of the Holy Spirit at work giving birth to and sustaining our Church. Just as awesome — the same Spirit is calling to us this day to take up our part in the Church's saving work.

In the first reading, from Acts, we see the creative genius of the Holy Spirit moving through the newly confirmed Apostles "who began to speak in different tongues as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim." The large crowd, gathered from all over the world were "amazed" and "astounded" that each one could understand the Apostles speaking in their own language.

Each one of us, young and old alike, is personally called today by the Holy Spirit into the same mission as that of the first Apostles — to advance the Kingdom of God in our corner of the world. Just as He did on that Pentecost day, the Holy Spirit speaks to us in our "own language" to give us the Good News of the Gospel and urge us to share it. We can think of our own language as the particular gifts, talents, and passions we possess. We experience the presence of the Holy Spirit through them and we are meant to put them to work in grateful service of the Kingdom of God.

When we consider the stewardship way of life we are called to live, we often focus on the challenges it poses. Surrendering ourselves to God is indeed a challenging way to live. But it leads to a life that is exciting, creative, and deeply rewarding. Stewardship allows us to experience life as a great adventure because it is a life guided and directed by the very source of power and creativity — the Holy Spirit!

Lectio Divina is a practice of scriptural reading. It involves meditating on a passage of the Bible, preferably the Gospel of the day.

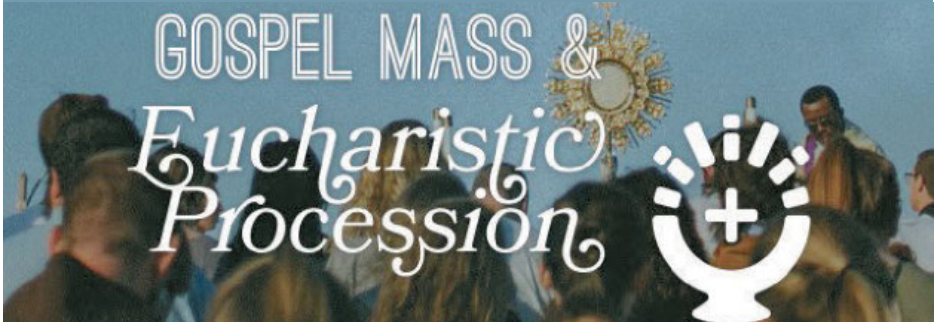

The feast of Pentecost came nine days after Jesus had ascended into Heaven. The disciples and Mary were praying together when the Holy Spirit suddenly came with the sound of a huge wind and what looked like flames of fire coming down on each of them. The apostles went right out and began to preach and teach people about Jesus.

The Holy Spirit comes to us in Baptism and lives in us whenever our souls are in a state of grace (when we don't have any serious sins.) He comes into us more whenever we receive a Sacrament, especially Confirmation. He helps us do what is right and serve God using all the gifts He gives us. The Holy Spirit, who is the third Person of the Blessed Trinity, draws us closer to God the Father and Jesus.

Pray to the Holy Spirit every day to help you to do everything for God. Then see how your life changes!

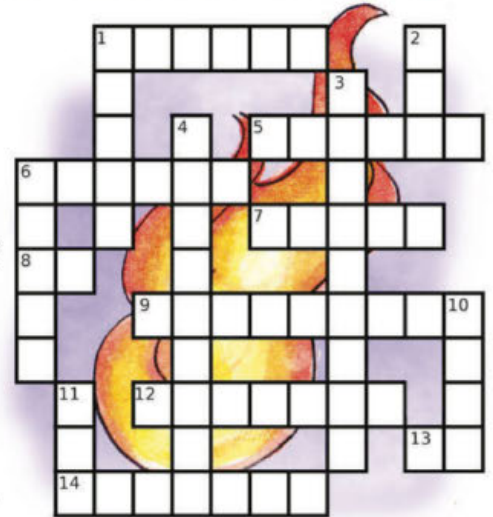

## A Glimpse of Spirituality (靈修一瞥) 25

The devil appears in the world, nothing but just hurting people until they die in hell, forever. When Jesus appeared, the devil wanted Jesus to die even more. If Jesus dies in the devil's hands, the whole world thus belongs to the evil power. The devil will consider that the cross is the last attack against Jesus.

Jesus, however, has resurrected. The devil cannot do anything to avoid it. In the same way, those who follow Jesus and die with him will naturally be resurrected by Jesus.

The problem is faith.

The boy's father said to Jesus, "it has often cast him into the fire and into the water, to destroy him." The verb "destroy" (apolesē) means the action to abolish, end up, or completely eliminate. Here it emphasizes putting oneself to death. However, instead of destroying the child, this life crisis strengthened the faith of his father. The father went on talking to Jesus, "if you can do anything, have mercy on us and help us."

"Can" (dynē) means being able to do something. The father did not look at worldly wishes but only God's will. He asked Jesus to help his child with mercy. The passive participle of "mercy" (splanchnistheis) indicates that Jesus was moved by the plight of the child and then offered a helping hand. Indeed, the father looked only to Jesus for mercy.

Jesus answered him, "All things are possible to him who believes."

Before praying to Jesus, there must be faith. If there is no faith, all miracles mean anything. Even Jesus resurrected Lazarus who had already died for four days; the false religious leaders were happy to find this as an excuse to kill him (see John 11:17-57).

"Faith" (pisteuonti) here points the conviction and trust to which a person is impelled by a certain inner and higher spirituality. Thus it stands absolutely to trust in Jesus as able to support either in obtaining or in doing something. The father sincerely believed that Jesus could help his child. From the father's answer to Jesus, people can see the father's heart that fully believes in Jesus: "I believe; help my unbelief!" The demon was therefore expelled from the child by Jesus.

Only by faith in Jesus can one gets rid of the devil. For those who worship Jesus and also the devil, Jesus finds no way to help.

父親繼續對耶穌說：“你若能做什麼，你就憐憫我們，幫助我們吧！”

“能” (dynē) 意即能夠做一些事，父親不看人願，只看天意，他讓耶穌以慈悲去幫助他的孩子。 “憐憫” (splanchnistheis) 這被動語態分詞，說明耶穌被孩子苦況打動慈悲心，然後施以援手。簡言之，父親只看耶穌慈悲。

耶穌回答他：“為信的人，一切都是可能的！”

祈求耶穌之前，是信德，如果沒有信德，就是耶穌復活死去四天的拉匝祿，虛假宗教領導只是用來殺害耶穌的藉口（參若 11:17-57）。

“信” (pisteuonti) 這裡解作被某種內在和更高的情操所推動的信念和信任；因此，父親絕對相信耶穌能夠幫助他的孩子。從父親給耶穌的回答，就可以看出父親的心，完全相信耶穌：“我信！請你補助我的無信吧！”魔鬼，因此就被耶穌從孩子身上驅逐出去。

相信耶穌，才能擺脫魔鬼；對於又拜耶穌又拜魔鬼的人

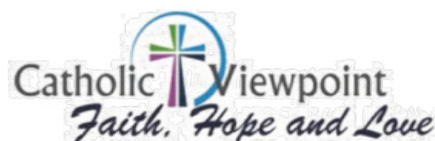
